Recognizing the fact that we are given no instruction booklets upon becoming parents and acknowledging the lack of information about support systems available ... Lowell Schools invite all parents, or those contemplating parenthood, to attend a series of three seminars devoted to information and discussion designed to enhance the skills needed by today's parents.

These seminars are a followup to the nationally televised documentary, "Generation at Risk" to be aired on Wednesday, January 28 at 8:00 p.m. on Channel 35. We encourage all families to view this presentation about the problems of young people: drug abuse, school drop-out rates, teen pregnancy and teen

nars will be held February 4, 11 and 18 in the Lowell Middle School Cafetorium at 7:30 p.m. Each seminar will feature an expert in the field of child and teen development. Middle School and High School parents are encouraged to bring their students with them and sitting will be provided for younger children.

GENERATION AT RISK is a follow-up to the very successful "Chemical People" project presented on PBS in November, 1983 that raised the nation's consciousness about the problem of teenage drug and alcohol abuse. The sequel widens the scope of concern beyond substance abuse to demonstrate that teen-age problems like pregnancy, dropping out of school, and suicide can be interrelated and pre-

GENERATION AT RISK recounts the stories of several teenagers who faced personal disaster yet overcame their problems with the help of their families, friends and neighbors. First Lady Nancy Reagan, who also appeared in "The Chemical People," joins the program host actor Sam Waterston to introduce viewers to the people and programs that rescued these troubled young people, rebuilt their self-

esteem, and reestablished com-

The program travels across the nation to profile ten community programs that are reaching today's teen-agers. Cameras record successes in Oklahoma; Odessa, Texas; New York City; Dalton and Atlanta, Georgia; Mt. Vernon, New York; Albuquerque, New Mexico, and Denver. From a school for teen mothers in Albuquerque, New Mexico, to a suicide prevention program in a suburban Denver high school, the special looks at the most serious problems teens can face -- and ways these problems are being solved.

WHAT IS CELLULITE?

Much has been written about the term "cellulite" in recent years, but not many of us actually know what it really is, how we get it, and, most importantly, how to rid ourselves of it. We hope this article will illuminate for you some of the solutions to these con-

Cellulite is the word used to describe the bulged, orange-peel appearance of fat that usually appears on the hips, thighs, and buttocks. Although much has been written about it, cellulite is still poorly understood. Recent research studies have compared fat specimens taken from people suffering from cellulite deposits with specimens taken from people free of the affliction and found no difference in the fat composition. This had led researchers to suggest that the question, "What is cellulite" should really be, "Why does fat sometimes appear rippled?"

Scientists now believe that the bumpy, waffle-like appearance of cellulite is thought to be a result of the connective tissue that envelopes each fat cell and separates these cells into compartments. As the fat cells fill, the compartmental restrictions cause them to bulge. Because cells fill, the compartmental restrictions cause them to bulge. Because about half of our stored fat is located directly beneath the skin, bulging fat cells can be quite apparent

Women are more easily affected by cellulite because their outer layer of skin is thinner and their fat compartments are larger and more rounded than those in men. Also, women tend to deposit fat on their hips, thighs and buttocks--areas in which cellulite appears easily--while men deposit fat around their waists.

Cellulite is not likely to occur unless you have excess fat. Accordingly, anyone afflicted with cellulite, and is interested in losing t, should a adopt a "common sense" plan comprised of diet and exercise. Toning and aerobic work-outs will also help. Eventually if dietary and exercise discipline is maintained, fat will be reduced everywhere, including those unsightly cellulite-rich areas.
