A new elementary redistricting policy was ushered into effect by the Lowell Board of Education Monday evening with little fanfare and virtually no opposition. Superintendent of Schools Dr. Fritz Esch said he came to the meeting prepared to answer the complaints of parents with children affected by the new

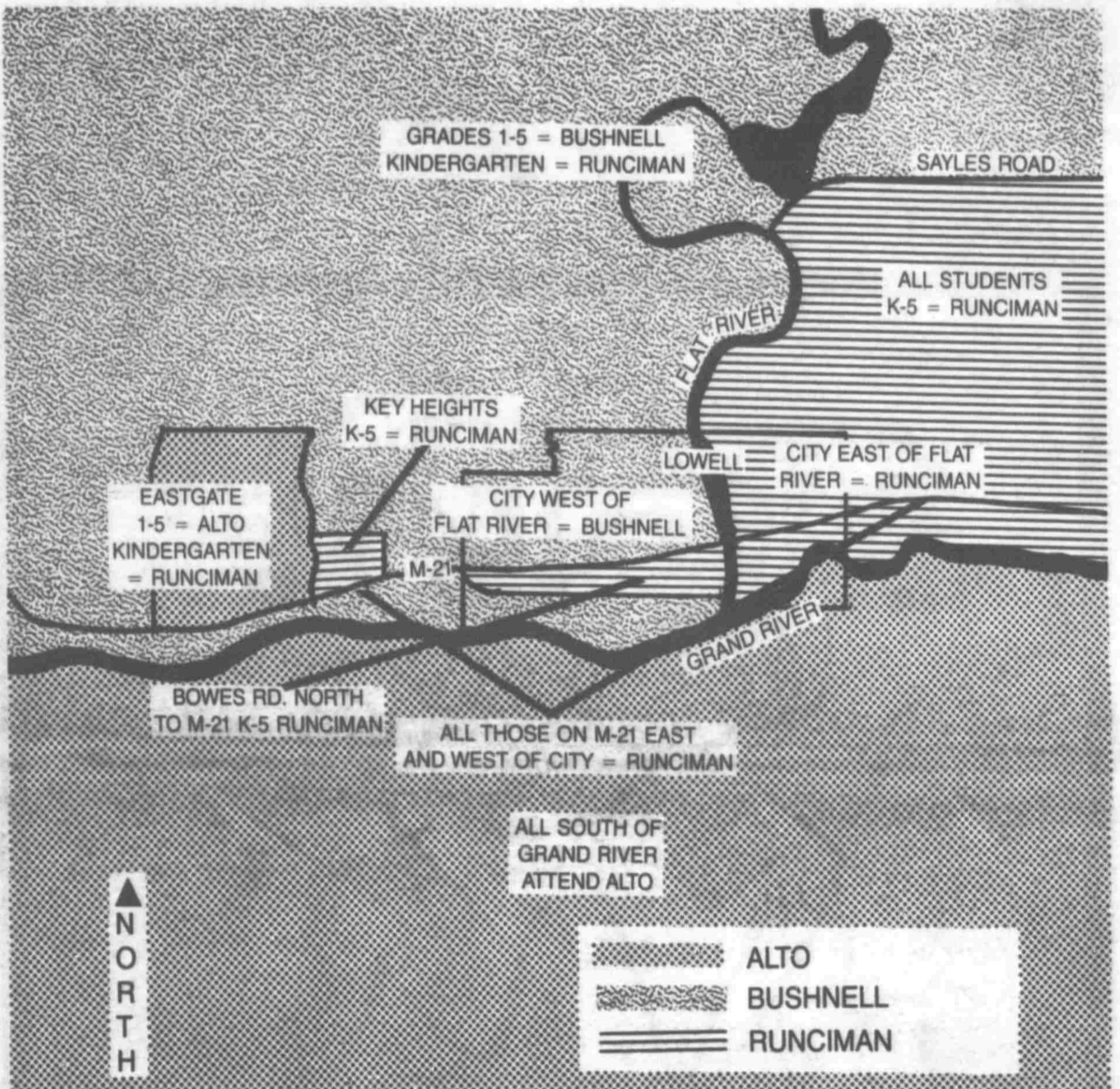

policy. Esch and the School Board members were surprised by the lack of opposition.

The proposal previously referred to as Plan Five was selected as the best answer to the district's unbalanced elementary population. The current overcrowding at Bushnell and vacant classrooms at Alto will be remedied under the new redistricting. As projected, Bushnell will have 507 students next year, Runciman 467 and Alto 450. Esch pointed out that those figures may vary slightly when school opens in the fall.

Plan Five calls for all K-5 students south of the Grand River to attend Alto. All 1-5 students in the Eastgate subdivision will also be bussed to Alto. All kindergarten students north of the Grand River, including those in Eastgate, will attend Runciman. Students in grades 1-5 living on Bowes Rd. and north to M-21 and those living on M-21 east and west of the city limits will attend Runciman. All 1-5 students residing in Valley Vista Mobile Home Park and Key Heights Mobile Home Park will be assigned to Runciman. If classroom levels warrant, some of the above students may be sent to Bushnell. Current boundary lines (basically the Flat River)

will separate Bushnell and Runciman. A small number of Bushnell and Runciman students are currently attending the school outside their district. These students will be returned to their proper schools by the new redistricting plan. Three additional elementary teachers will be needed to put the plan into effect.

The resolution passed by the School Board contained a final paragraph stating that the Board and Administration will continue to monitor the future enrollment projections and noted that the continued excellence of the Lowell K-12 program may require additional classrooms and facilities.

The redistricting plan was the result of a year-long study conducted by a committee appointed by the School Board. The committee held several public hearings and submitted their conclusions to the School Board in September of 1986.

The Lowell district has experienced a steady growth in its elementary student population since 1983 which has put a serious load on the three elementary schools. Projections through 1990 call for a total of 1,417 K-5 students in the elementary system, a 20 percent increase over

the 1,130 enrolled in 1983. The system's overall student population hasn't increased drastically because of smaller class sizes now attending the middle and high schools, but when the large classes now in the elementary schools move up, the total enrollment will increase dramatically. If enrollment continues to ex-

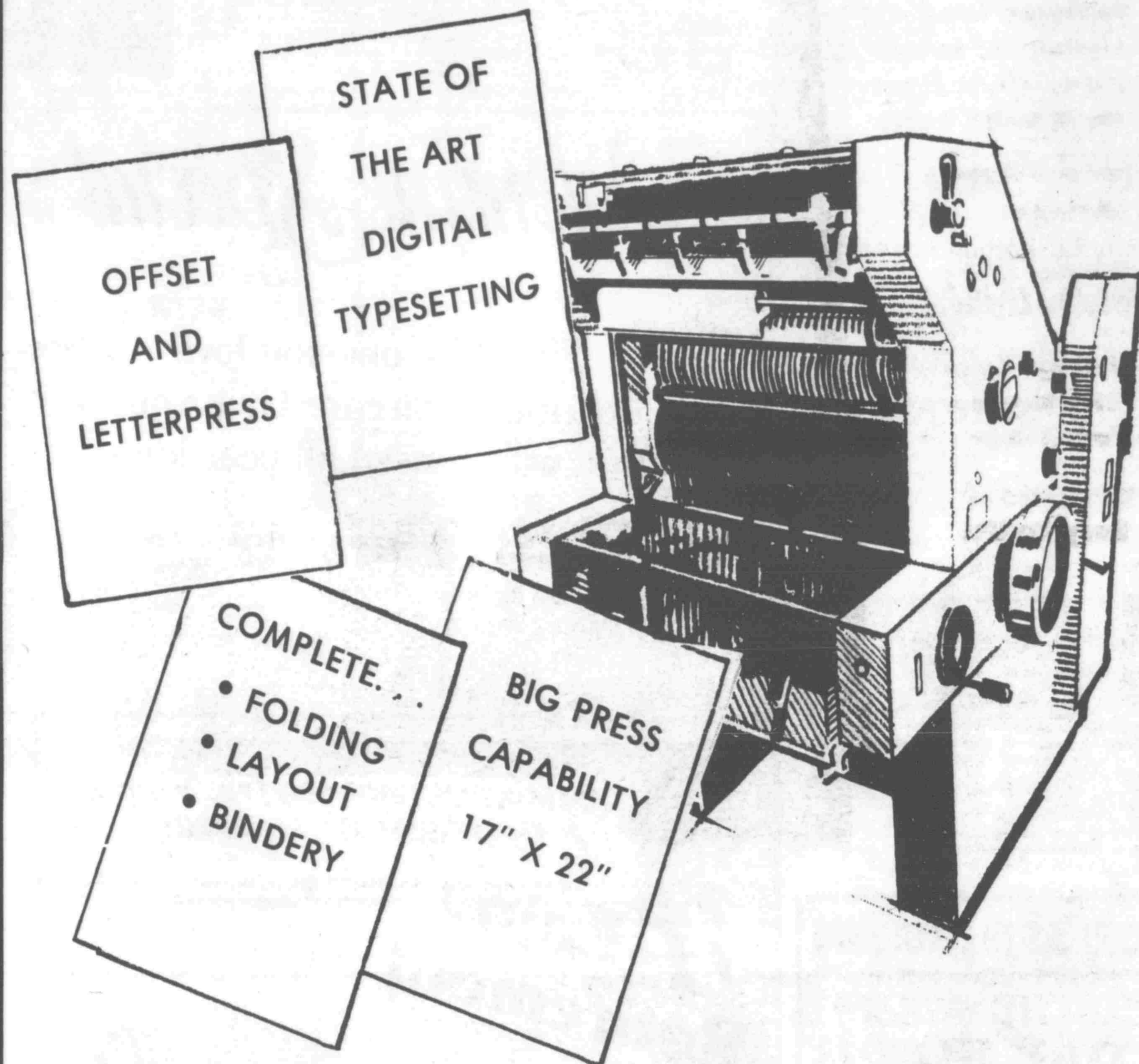

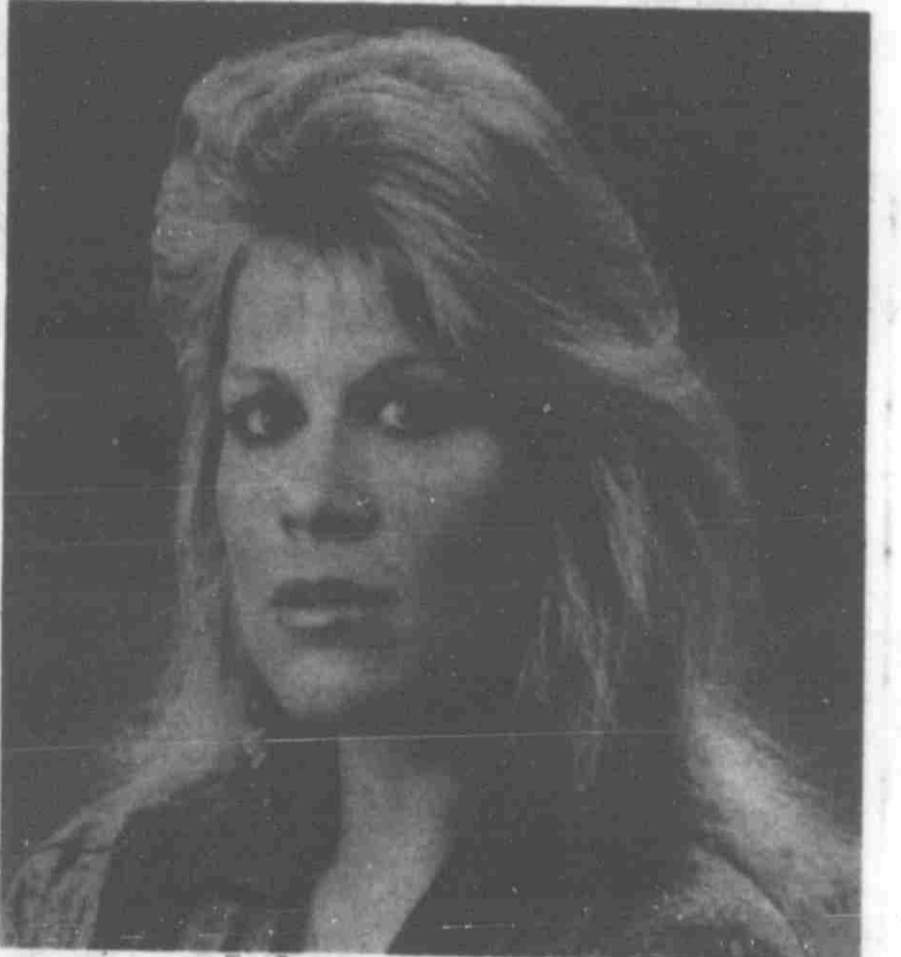

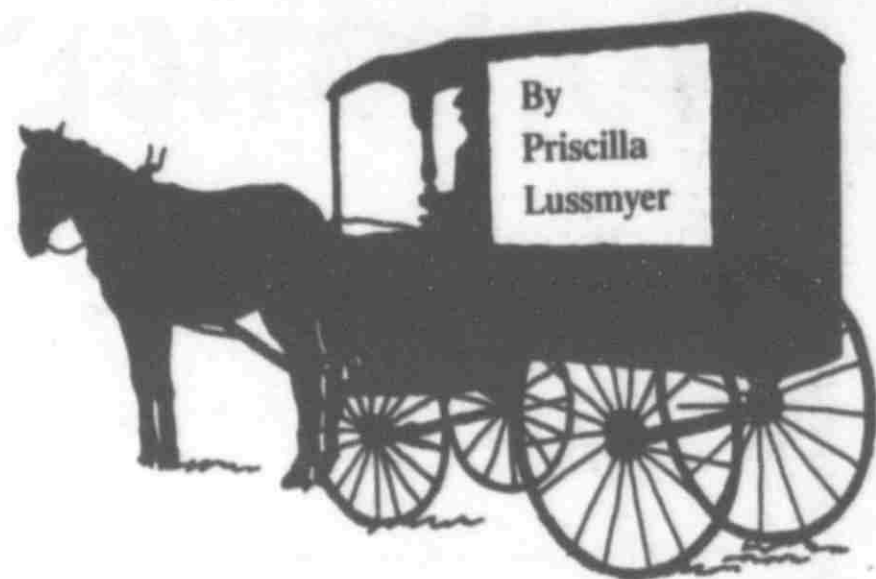

Walter Gumser resigns from the City Council in the wake of the vote to sell Lowell Light and Power rural lines, a move he opposed.

## Board Briefs

The Lowell Board of Education held its regular meeting on Monday, February 9, 1987.

Following the payment of bills, the Board approved a maternity leave for high school special education teacher, Mrs. Nannette Whitley.

The Board then adopted a resolution calling for new elementary boundaries to alleviate overcrowding at Bushnell and to utilize available classrooms at Alto. A separate article on the new boundaries will appear elsewhere in this publication.

In other matters, the superintendent's evaluation was made public by President Chris VanAntwerp who stated that Superintendent Esch is doing a fine job. The Board adopted revised Board Policy #5125.2 entitled "Right to Access and Privacy of Students' Records." This policy calls for notification by students or parents if they do not want any directory-type information published such as height and

weight in athletic contest publications.

The Board then established a Goals Committee chaired by John Haggai with members Sandy Nagy and Wayne Dowling. The committee will meet with administrators to determine the direction for the district in establishing long range plans and short range objectives. A request made by Mr. and Mrs. Stephen Williams to transfer their property from Lowell to the Forest Hills School District was denied.

In the last item of business the Board rejected all retro-fitting bids received on December 17, 1986 since the bids came in significantly higher than what was budgeted. The Board then authorized the engineering firm to re-submit bids with alterations to the specifications.
