RAILROAD MATTERS.

The Lowell & Hastings People Are Ready for Business.

Matters in relation to the Lowell & Hastings extension from Lowell to Belding have been kept rather quiet of late but all the same the projectors of the scheme have been sawing wood at a righ lively gait. It is now announced that the right of way between Lowell and Belding has been secured with the exception of two or three pieces for which parties are asking what the railroad people deem an exorbitant price; and it is now stated that condemnation proceedings will be instituted to secure a settlement of these disputed claims. Attorney Fyfe has been here this week looking up the matter of right of way through that portion of the city through which the road is to pass, but this part of the matter will be one easy of adjustment. In the meantime we have it on what may be deemed the best of authority that the ties, spikes and other material for the construction of the road have been contracted for and will be ready as soon as the roadbed is in condition for their use. It is stated that active operations will begin on the construction as early in the spring as the weather will permit and the work will be pushed as rapidly as possible.-[Belding Star.





UNLUCKY DAYS AND HOURS. A German Statistician Has Figures

> Out Just When Accidents Are Most Likely.

Only a painstaking, plodding German investigator would go to the trouble of trying to find out by statistics on what day of the week most accidents occur and at what hour of the day. This is what has been done by Dr. Wolff, of

Strasburg. He bases his conclusions on 1,071 cases of accidents among the working classes. It thus appears that Monday is not less unlucky than Friday when it comes to accidents, and for this fact he accounts by the statement that the drinking shops are most frequented by workmen in Germany on the days pre-vious, viz., Saturdays, Sundays and Thursdays.

Fewer accidents happen on Tuesday than on any other day of the week, because on no day are drinking houses so empty as on Monday.

He has also discovered the remakable fact that the hours after breakfast. dinner and the afternoon rest, are signalized by most accidents. He attributes this to the lassitude

caused by the work of digestion, and to the use made by men of intoxicants during meal times.

He also establishes the fact that in

factories where the meal hours are greatly curtailed there is an excess of accidents over the factories where the men are more liberally treated in this
