Three Hundred Employees of the Scranton Railway on Strike. A COMPLETE IS TIRED FEARED Men Demand Shorter Hours and Better Pay—Indicates That the Strike Will Spread Extensively and Travel Cease.

Scranton, Pa., Dec. 24.—Every one of the 300 car and barn employees of the Scranton Railway Co. obeyed the strike order which went into effect at 8 o'clock Sunday, and as a consequence only two cars were run in all of the Lackawanna valley Sunday.
