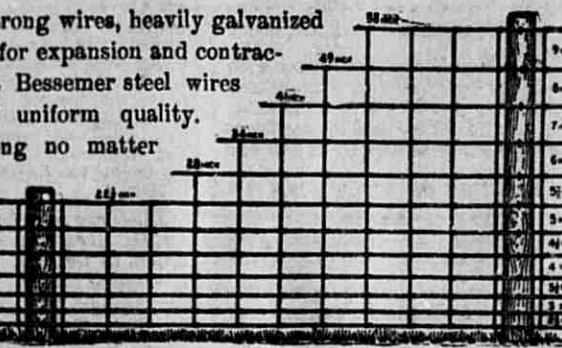

MADE A BIG GAIN.

VILLAGE GOT AHEAD \$5,000 LAST YEAR.

Some of the Work Done by Retiring Officers.

At the Village election Monday, March 14, successors will be chosen to President Hakes, Trustees Look, Winegar and Collar, Clerk Murphy, Treasurer McMahon and Assessor Yelter, Trustees Nicholson, Lee and Smith holding over.

A large amount of work has been done by this push during the past year, some items from which may be of interest.

Crosswalks and sidewalks of cement to amount of 3,885 feet were built at net cost of \$2,550, of which the Village paid \$1,077.26.

Broadway, Monroe, Washington and West Main streets have been graveled, some of it very heavily.

Four sand traps connecting with sewers have been placed to carry off stagnant water from the streets. The old Arc lamp system has been replaced by one of improved, enclosed arcs, 27 lamps on streets and 46 in stores at a cost of \$1,100; and the placing of electric meters begun by previous administration has been completed.

The earnings of the Light & Power plant were \$9,674.69, disbursements \$7,540.71, which includes \$1,150 interest on bonds.

It has cost \$114 to clean snow from walks this winter, an amount much in excess of the average winter.

The treasury has on hand \$6,362.60, an excess of amount on hand one year ago of a little over \$5,000, which is surely a good gain.

The official financial statement will be published in our next issue.

SAW COUNTY GROW.

Mrs. D. C. McVean Was One of the Earliest Pioneers of Kent.

Alto, Mich., Feb. 19.—Mrs. D. C. McVean, one of the pioneer residents of Kent county, was buried this afternoon in the cemetery at Bowne Center. She died Tuesday from paralysis at the age of 86 years. Mrs. McVean moved here from York state with her husband in September, 1844 and the two cleared a farm from the wilderness, in which there were then only a few white persons. In January, 1857, Mr. McVean became county treasurer, but on Oct. 28 of the same year he died from pneumonia, as the result of exposure at the burning of the county buildings in Grand Rapids.

Mrs. McVean, with seven small children, returned to the farm, where she lived until her death. She was a woman of great energy and showed as much interest in public affairs as in the management of her farm. She had the honor of naming the Alto postoffice and was its first postmistress.

Six children survive her, of whom two, Mrs. M. Remington and Mrs. B. Thompson, live in Grand Rapids. One, Hobart McVean, lives in Alto, and the three others, Mary, Margaret and Dow, on the old homestead.—[Grand Rapids Press.

OLD RESIDENT GONE

MRS. MARY ATKINS LIVED IN THIS VICINITY

Over Forty Years. Died Friday, February 19.

Mary E. Somerby was born in Montpelier, Vermont, Dec. 4, 1831. She was a daughter of Captain Joseph Somerby and first cousin of Admiral Dewey. May 29, 1861 she was united in marriage to William J. Atkins and came to Michigan settling in Grattan. In 1871 she removed to Lowell where she has since resided. After a long illness of intense suffering she passed to the better world Feb. 19, 1904, leaving besides her husband, one brother in New York city, two sisters in California and many other relatives and friends to mourn her loss.

Railroad Power House. How is This Lowell?

The last issue of the Saranac Advertiser has the following, which we hope may awake some of our citizens who are peacefully slumbering, or "niddling while Rome burns:"

Frank Westcock secretary of the Grand Rapids & Ionia electric railroad, spent last week here closing up the deals of the right of way that their representative E. R. Phinney had arranged. Before leaving for Lowell Monday Mr. Phinney informed The Advertiser the right of way was secured with the exception of two or three tracts. These will be taken care of later, providing a reasonable settlement be had if not when they reach that point in construction they will secure the right as the law provides. As far as we can learn these gentlemen have been very fair in their dealings with the people and have accepted every offer that was within reason and those who have not made a deal with them had better cut the cost before they allow the matter to get into the courts.

President C. G. Johnson and the village board took up the question of the location of the power house with secretary Westcott last week. This is a matter that is of interest to every property owner in Saranac and every one should lend their aid, influence and best efforts to land the power house.

This means an improvement that will be one of the best possible stepping stones to the future prosperity and improvement of our village. The present board has a faculty of pushing improvements for the village to a successful termination. Give them your united support in this matter.

From Our Point of View

REPORT comes from Washington that the President proposes to encourage a hot campaign in the black districts of the South, with a view to securing more Republican congressmen from those districts. Such a course would certainly breed a race war; and Mr. Roosevelt would as surely lose more in the North than he could gain in the South. Fair-minded people regardless of partisanship, have about determined that the South shall be permitted to solve its race problem; and they will not approve of Negro rule in any state. Teddy has plenty of Democrat votes coming, and he had best leave this proposition alone—it is red hot.

THE LEDGER is not disposed to be a "kicker," but it is free to confess that it would not have hurt Postmaster Quick a mite to have opened his office on hour Monday evening. The little trouble required to have favored his patrons at that hour is a small matter compared to the welfare of two thousand people. The post office force has its rights, and a considerable public could not justly complain if the office were opened on holidays at the morning and evening hours, giving the clerks the intervening hours to themselves. Such an arrangement would be fair for all concerned.

As THE BOTH system of voting will be used in the village caucus, everyone will be free to express his choice of candidates and all will have an equal chance. There will be no "accusation" business or no hurrah politics, and under the circumstances many think a second caucus would be unnecessary. But our people should remember that in such case, the caucus will be the real election; and it behooves every good citizen to attend the caucus and express his wishes, or forever after to hold his peace.

IN HIS opposition to the skyrocket promotion of Doctor Wood, the late Senator Hanna was right; and it was all the more creditable because the stand was against that of the president of his own party, showing an independence that is too often lacking in our public men. Now that the leader of the opposition is dead, the promotion will probably be confirmed; but it will be wrong just the same, for "whatever is" is not always "right."

WHEN children come into the home, firearms should go out. Some men learned this years ago through the sad experiences of others; but that Iowa father who left a revolver under his pillow will regret it to the last day of his life. In pure play his four-year-old son shot and killed the baby brother. The father's lamentations, however great and sincere, are of no avail except as other parents shall heed the warning. The experience of Frank Lader in Grand Rapids is a warning against buying things of unknown value of fly-by-night fakirs. He has lost both money and "jewel," but if he confines his dealings to responsible firms hereafter, the experience will be worth its cost.
