DIED OF LOCK-JAW MRS. SMITH'S ESTATE

BEING FOUGHT IN PROBATE COURT.

Leaves a Wife and Three Children Some Hot Word Passes Between Contestants.

There were sensational develop-ments today in Probate court in the contest over the estate of the late Thirza A. Smith. Emanuel Scott, the contestant, said be once carried Smith's mail to him, while one letter was addressed to him as "Smith" another was addressed to quite a different name.

Thereupon Scott demanded what his brother-in-law's name really was, anybow, a fight ensued, at the end of which, Scott and his wife were ordered off the premises. At first they refused to go on the ground that the property belonged to Mrs. Smith, Scott's sister. Smith answered according to Scott's story. Well if the place isn't mine now she'll give it to me some time, and if she doesn't I'll kill her." Scott swore that he and his wife conveyed this threat to Mrs. Smith who was greatly frightened, and who, from that time on, was not allowed by Smith to communicate with her rel-

Smith himself was asked whether be felt sorry after his wife's death. He swore that he did, but acknowledged that he married again within a month.

Smith's attorneys are seeking to show that Scott has a criminal record. In response to searching questions he denied that he had ever been in Columbus penitentiary; that he escaped from there, and that he had been arrested on the harge of assault with the intention of committing great bodly harm, less than the crime of murder.

The hearing before Judge Jewell is exceedingly warm. Both Smith and Scott were so excited at the con-clusion of the morning's hearing that the adjournment probably pre-vented a fight in court.—[Grand Rapids Press, Dec. 7.
