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

TRIAL AMUSES THE CROWD. LAWYERS VS. WITNESSES.

Claims the Cider was Sweet. Adjourned till Saturday.

GRAND RAPIDS, Mich., May 2.—A rich vein of comedy, verdant but ir-repressible, pervaded the tes-timony of witnesses at the examina-ion of Samuel Vandenbroeck, the the young Lowell farmer who fired two charges of bird shot into a chartwo charges of bird shot into a char-ivari party. His examination on the charge of assault with intent to do great bodily harm less than the crime of murder, was conducted be-fore Judge Holcomb in justice court vesterday afternoon yesterday afternoon.

Vandenbroeck is only 18 years old, and his bride one year his junior. The court-room was filled with men and women from the neighboring townships and they got their mon-

ey's worth. That nothing stronger than cider was drunk on that eventful occasion was the testimony of the state's witnesses. Louis Wringler didn't even indulge to that extent, he said. 'Wasn't it buttermilk you drank?" inquired M. L. Dunham, counsel for the defendant. 'Yes, sir.'
