

### The Russians' Strange Conception of Liberty.

The frenzied acts of Russians, just assured of the blessings of "Life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness," for themselves, illustrate a lamentable but frequently exhibited trait of human (or shall we say Inhuman) nature. After centuries of degradation and dishonor, having just passed through a long and bloody war, which had spread sorrow and desolation which its strength depends. broadcast over their land, they were naturally expected to pends. Such a condition calls welcome the pursuits of peace, to give themselves over to the restoration of order and industry and to the healing of the awful wounds of war. But while the liberty bells were still ringing, with the shouts of their own freedom yet on their lips, they hurled themselves upon their Jewish neighbors with the lerocity of wild beasts and slew them by thousands, men, womand attitions in that most horrible of earthly horrors—a en and children, in that most horrible of earthly horrors-a

"religious" massacre.

It is no new thing—this murderous "religious" fanaticism; it is as old as the history of man: and its spirit, the willingness to do if the power and opportunity offered, still shows itself in the acts of heresy-hunting bigots and fanatics of all stripes and sizes. A most noteworthy example is that of the Puritan Pilgrim Fathers, who fled from bitter persecution in the Old World to the bleak shores of New England, in order that they might 'worship God according to England, in order that they might 'worship God according to the dictates of their own consciences." Hardly had they landed, before they enacted laws restricting the right of suffrage to church members and making church attendance compulsory; and drove Roger Williams and Anne Hutchinson into the wilderness for protesting against such bigotry.
