FARMERS INSTITUTE A WEEK OF SORROW

Important Questions Discussed at Lowell Meeting.

The Farmers institute was called to order soon after 10:30, A. M. Thursday with an attendance of about 40 farmers and most of the time until noon was occupied by W. F. Taylor in a talk on crop rotation, explaining in detail what he considered a good rotation. He said that one reason for not raising the same crop several years in succession on the same ground was that plants seem to leave in the soil a kind of toxin poison that was injurious to that crop and that certain crops do not succeed in following certain other crops. He recommended a short rotation with more clover than is generally raised.

A. M. Andrews led the discussion urging ploughing under more clover and keeping more sheep.

Mr. Taylor took a large part of the afternoon in explaining a dairy cow, feeding, care, silo, etc. In the absence of Melvin McPherson, L. J. Post gave a short talk on fruit, urging the farmers to study more carefully the habits of the different insects and fungi; and the action of the different chemicals used for their control. There were about ninety present in the afternoon.

The evening was given up to educational subjects, Prof. E. J. Martin presiding.

A. M. Freeland, commissioner of schools, was followed by President D. B. Waldo of Kalamazoo Normal and Mr. Taylor the estate speaker. President Waldo's talk was especially good. The speaking was interspersed with music by the high school, Harley Maynard and Mr. Taylor.

The attendance was as good as could have been expected considering conditions in the village and that there was a large Grange meeting at Alto where ex-Master Horton was the speaker.—[Com.]
