t seems to be the natural thing for the one bitten to insist on the immediate destruction of the dog; and when that is done, it is impossible to tell whether the dog was rabid or not without analysis of a portion of the animal's brain, which in itself is not always reliable, aside from being troublesome and somewhat expen-

mended by the State Board of Health is "to cause the animal to be securely confined in such a manner that it is not possible to bite any person or animal, and if the dog is rabid, it will die within eight days. There may then be time for the person bitten to undergo preventive treatment While if the animal is proved not to have had rables, such trouble may be prevented, as also the anxiety which otherwise would follow."

Manicuring a Horse.

A horse's hoof is really the same thing as the toe or finger nails of human beings, or of animals having toes. The hoof grows just as a toe nail does and more rapidly on unshod horses than on those wearing shoes. Its growth is much faster on horses that are well groomed and well fed. upon an average of a third of an inch a month. The hind hoofs grow faster than the fore hoofs. The toe of the hoof being the longest part, it takes longer for it to grown down there than at the heel. The new hoof grows out any cracks or defects in the whole, grandually working down to where it can be cut off, just as with human finger nails.
