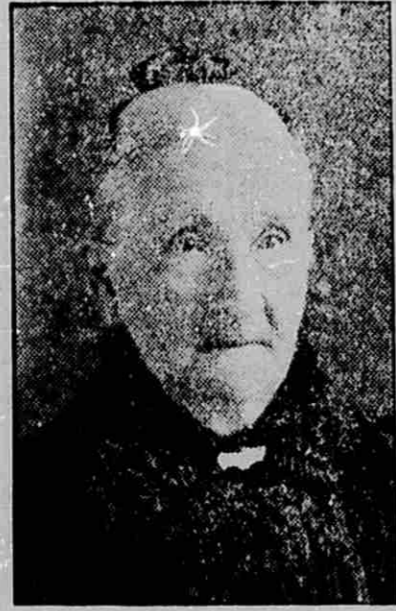

FIVE OLD RESIDENTS

Lowell, Boston and Vergennes Lose Good Pioneer Citizens.



Mrs. Maggie Ryder.

Mrs. Magdalena Ryder died at the home of Rowland Ryder in Vergennes, Tuesday evening, at the age of 88 years and 2 months after an illness of more than a year. Funeral services will be held tomorrow (Friday) afternoon at 2 o'clock, at the late home of deceased, conducted by Rev. W. D. Ogg. Burial at Oakwood.

Magdalena Moyo was born in Switzerland February 19, 1822. She came to America and Michigan in 1851 to the home of her brother Samuel Moyo of Vergennes. She married E. W. Ryder in Grand Rapids in 1856 and three years later they came to Vergennes and settled on the Indian reservation on Flat river, where they lived until 1871, when they built a home just over the line in Lowell village and occupied it. Mr. Ryder died in April 1872; and his widow has kept the home all these years until within the past year the infirmities of age have compelled her to rely upon the care of others.

Mrs. Ryder was a Christian and affiliated with the Baptist church. She was also a member of the Hooker Pioneer society almost from its organization.

She leaves one son Albert, nephews, nieces, and a host of friends who will hold her in loving remembrance.

Henry F. Clark.

Henry F. Clark died at his home in this village April 20 after a month's illness of chronic bronchitis, aged 62 years. Private funeral at the home Friday, April 22.

Mr. Clark was born in Elgin, Ill., March 22, 1848, and came to Lowell 40 years ago, for 30 years of which time he conducted the Lowell woolen mills.

He leaves to mourn his death a widow, Sarah J. Clark, one son John O. Clark, two daughters, Mrs. Kittie M. Cotton and Mrs. Edna Colvin, all residents of Lowell except Mrs. Colvin whose home is at Alaska.

Ezekiel B. Hakes died at the home of his son H. W. Hakes, Wednesday forenoon, April 20, aged nearly 80 years. Private funeral Friday afternoon at the home, Rev. Russell H. Bready officiating. Mr. Hakes was born in Canaan New York, June 4, 1830, and came to Lowell in 1881 and this was his home until death. He was united in marriage to Sarah J. Peck April 18, 1856. To this union were born four children, three of whom survive: H. W. and P. P. Hakes of Lowell and Mrs. Nellie Godfrey of Hastings, who with other relatives and many friends will mourn and miss him in the days to come.

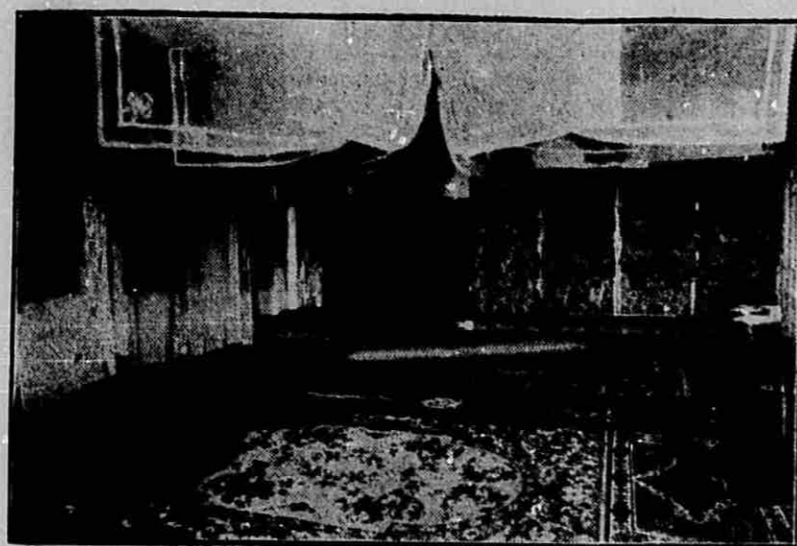

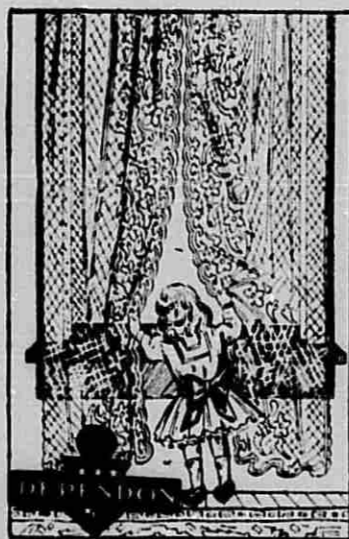

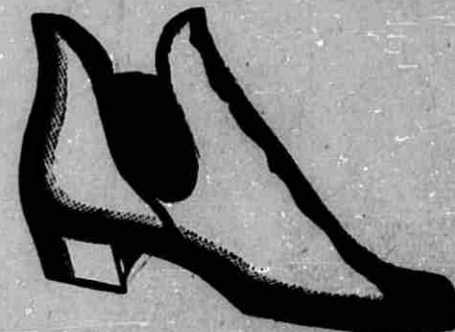
