Dratz Manufacturing Company Closed Under Mortgage.

The factory of the Dratz Manufacturing company has been closed under a chattel mortgage held jointly by the two Lowell banks; and is advertised to be sold at 10 o'clock Saturday, March 4.

A portion of the plant is temporarily being used by the Michigan Bent Rim company in getting out some work; but the property is in charge of an officer.

The action of the banks is on account of the failure of the Dratz company to meet its obligations and for self protection. The trouble is said to have originated with the inability of the stockholders to agree among themselves.

The personal property only is covered by the mortgage; the real estate being held by the Lowell Board of Trade.

While the property has had an unfortunate experience, this being its third failure, it is a good one. Some one—the right party—will buy it and do a prosperous business there yet.

Death of Mrs. Eugene Comstock of Lowell Township.

Mrs. Eva Comstock, wife of Eugene Comstock, died at her home south of Lowell, Feb. 23, 1911. She was born in Ionia county April 12, 1881, and had lived in Lowell or its vicinity since she was three years of age. A husband and seven young children survive her, as also do her mother, three sisters and three brothers. The natural sympathy and sorrow of friends is in this case intensified by the destitute condition of the family and the dependent ages of the children. A very fitting and tangible expression of this sympathy was given by the neighbors and friends of the community, who readily gave needed help and generous contributions. The smallest of the children are being cared for by these kind friends until the father can determine his future plans.

The funeral service was held Saturday morning, conducted by Rev. J. R. Wooton of the Methodist church. After a brief service at the house the body was taken to Clarksville where the funeral service was held in the Wesleyan Methodist church, and interment made in the Clarksville cemetery. The ladies of the church had tastefully decorated the church for the service and as a crowning act of gracious hospitality served a most excellent dinner to the entire funeral party in the church after the funeral service. He who said, "Inasmuch as ye have done it unto one of the least of these, my brethren, ye have done it unto me," can not but note with kindly regard the many gracious expressions of sympathy and helpfulness called forth in connection with this sad event. The sympathy of all will go out to the family in its sorrow and need.—(Com.)
