James E. Green, candidate for supervisor, had a card in the Herald of April 3 and in the Herald of April 4, which begins with this misleading statement referring to THE LEDGER:

"I regret the necessity of going out of Lowell in order to take my political ideas before the people, one home paper refusing to print them on the ground that it would violate their policy of the past."

A half-truth is said to be worse than an untruth and Mr. Green's statement is one of that sort. We requested Mr. Bergin to permit us to Mr. Bergin read the former's article in order that the latter's reply might appear in the same issue of THE LEDGER before election. This Mr. Green refused to do; and he took the article away without any formal refusal on our part to publish the same.

Our reason was this: It was the last issue before election and the last chance of Mr. Green's statement being read by one candidate to reply to a charge by another. In the previous issue, reporting the nominations, we had reported the rival candidates for supervisor with absolute impartiality. To have admitted Mr. Green's article with its insinuating attacks on Mr. Bergin, without giving the latter an opportunity to reply, would in our humble judgment have been rankly unfair. Had Mr. Green's article had appeared in the week previous, or had there been another issue before election, we would have admitted his article without question.

Mr. Bergin offered a statement attacking Mr. Green, our attitude would have been the same.

This is the "policy of the past" referred to by Mr. Green, simply one of square-dealing justice; and we submit to the fair-minded people of Lowell that it is a good policy.
