Across the plain. For an hour or more we drove across the plain, the arched hood of the wagon framing the huge white bulk of the Taurus.

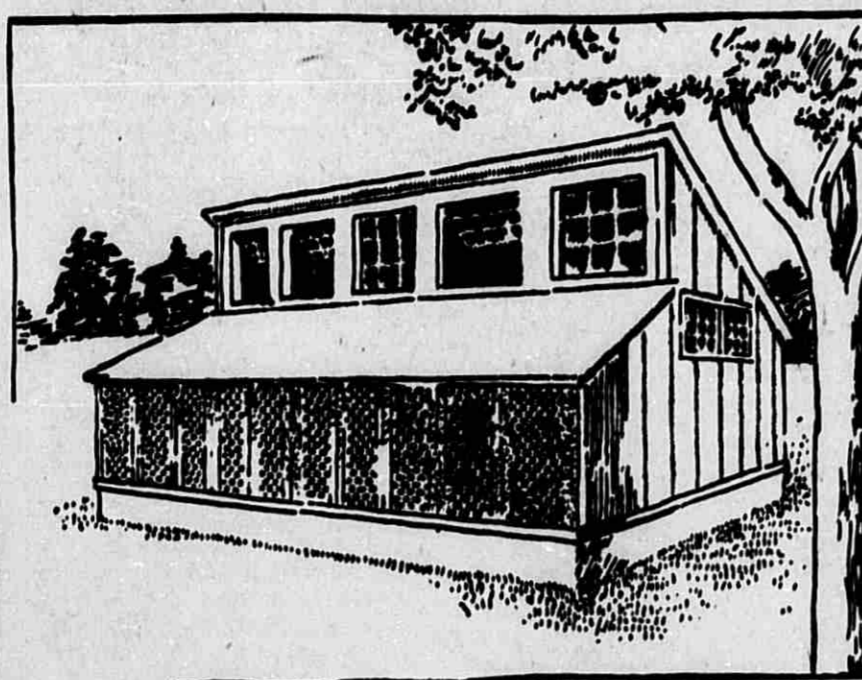

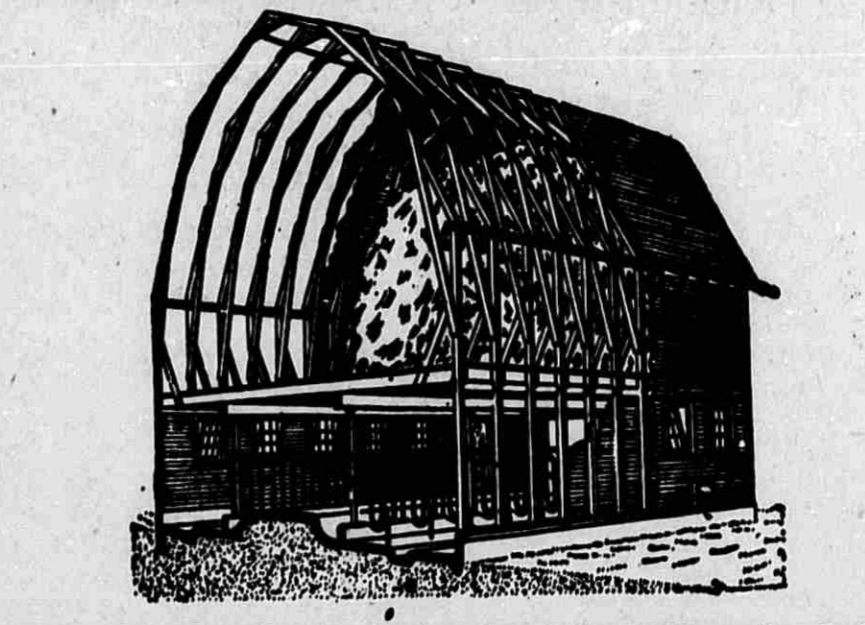

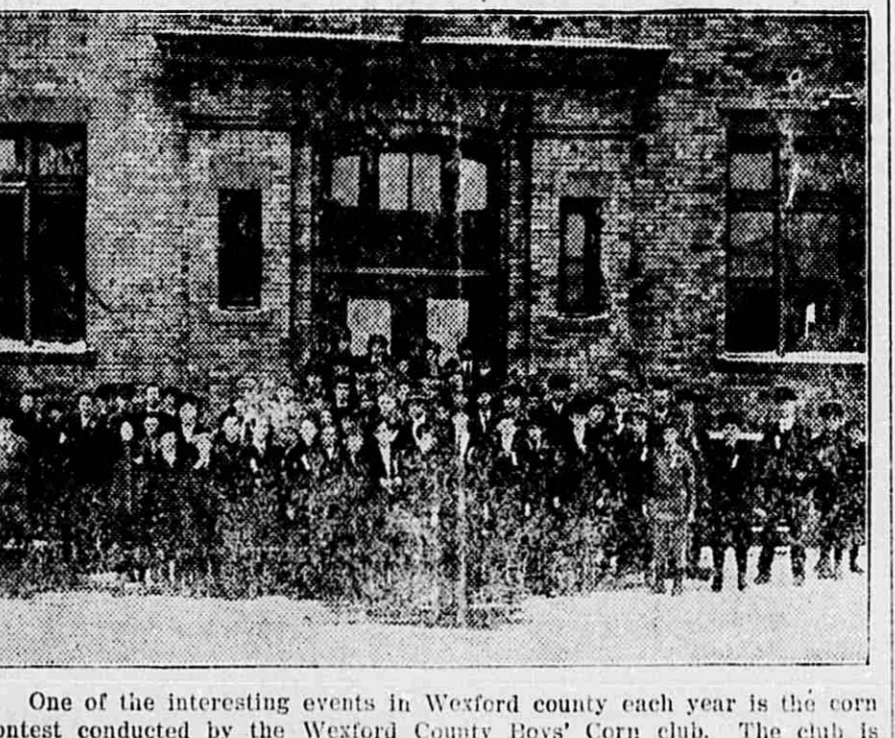
