LOWELL PIONEER DEATH OF MRS. BLISS

Jabez H. Hull Passed Away Last Friday.

Jabez H. Hull was born in the state of New York March 23, 1835. His spirit passed to its God, at his home in Lowell Aug. 31, 1917, surrounded by his family, at the age of 82 years, 5 months and 8 days.

He came with his parents to Michigan, township of Keene, Ionia county in 1845. He was united in marriage with Celestia M. Gibson in 1856; who survives to mourn the loss of her companion after more than 61 years in loving companionship. Two sons were born to this union, Wheeler J. and Wm. W., who with their companions administered tenderly to the father through his illness.

Three brothers of the deceased survive him, namely: A. L. of Smyrna, M. L. of Keene township and Rolland of Oregon.

The deceased was a veteran of the Civil war in the 13th Michigan Infantry and was with Sherman on his famous march to the sea. He was never wounded although balls passed through his hat and coat. He received an honorable discharge at the close of the war.

He was converted at the age of eighteen. Mr. and Mrs. Hull both united with the Baptist church in Keene in 1859. In 1872 they came to Lowell and in 1873 placed their letters with the Lowell Baptist church; where they have ever been faithful and greatly beloved members. Our brother was a quiet, reserved disposition. He loved the church and his faith in Christ wavered not, but having made his peace with God and plans for the services at funeral, he fell asleep in Jesus, blessed sleep from which none ever wake to weep.

Funeral services conducted by Pastor J. E. Bodine from the home Sunday at 2 o'clock p. m. A large circle of old acquaintances and friends were in attendance. Burial in Oakwood cemetery. May Heaven's richest blessing rest upon the bereaved family.—J. E. B.

AGED PIONEER GONE

John G. Reuter Laid to Rest at Freeport.

John G. Reuter, father of Mrs. Caroline Yeiter of Lowell, died September 1 on the homestead near Freeport, where he settled in the wilderness over sixty years ago. Funeral services were held at the home Tuesday, Rev. Russell H. Bready officiating; burial by the Masonic fraternity at Freeport cemetery. He is survived by his wife and seven children, twenty grandchildren and four great grandchildren.

Mr. Reuter was a veteran of the Civil war and a member of the Congregational church at Freeport. He had been ill for three months, and was nearly 82 years old.

He had been a life-long friend to his townsmen and neighbors. The funeral was one of the most largely attended in that section for many years.
