



They are called the "soldiers' club house." In them a soldier can find paper from his home town, the best of magazines and books and clean

healthful amusements. What has impressed me most is the great percentage of soldiers who read religiously their testament. All classes and all natioalities carry the little khaki covered book with them and to see a soldier reading his Bible is as common as to see a civilian read his newspaper. The majority of them fully realize the seriousness of the task they have to face and are girding themselves with the armor of the Fathers, placing themselves wholly in the command, their captain and guide. As I sit in the "Y" hut writing this, I can see the words "Christ was a clean soldier," and as I leave the building I will read another placard with, "Make me clean in heart, oh Lord." These are silent sentincls, but they are havign their effect and the national army will embark for France, clean in mind and body, true soldiers and real men.
