By EDWARD B. CLARK. Washington.—In the corridors of the capitol and on the streets of Washington today one frequently hears that nothing like the present conflict between the administration and the senate on the subject of a treaty ever occurred before in the history of the country.

However there is nothing new under the sun in this case. When the senate chooses to dig a little into the records, or even into the history of events which are supposed to be familiar, he generally finds a parallel to a present case, no matter what that case may be.

The people for some time have been witnessing a conflict of opinion and of action between the president and the senate committee on foreign relations on the subject of a treaty, a conflict which has had good many dramatic features. Has anything of this kind happened before? Yes, and so long ago that the people still living remember the circumstances. In fact, there have been several similar cases in the past.

It was an internal row on the part of the senate which was the cause in that kind. The American administration was sympathetic with the French cause and the British cause.

Charles Sumner, chairman of the committee, was not antagonistic to the treaty looking to the annexation of San Domingo as Senator Lodge, chairman of the committee, was not.
