LECTURES TO HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS AND FARMERS.

Roswell G. Carr, Kent county agricultural agent makes the following announcement:

Mr. B. M. Hain, of the Department of Entomology at the Michigan Agricultural college will be in Lowell on January 19. He will talk to the High school students in the afternoon and to the farmers in the evening.

Mr. Hain will have a stereopticon machine and slides and give a talk on "Michigan Insects and Their Control." He will also have time to discuss some other farm problems.

Farmers and any one else interested in such matters are invited. There will be no charge. The meeting will begin at eight o'clock.

FARM BUREAU DECEMBER REPORT.

Synopsis of business done by Michigan State Farm Bureau for month ending Dec. 24, 1920.

The purchasing department handled 116 cars of commodities, including salt, fence posts, coal, cottonseed meal, oil meal, mixed feed, flour, etc., with 134 cars in transit making a grand total of 250 cars of actual filled orders. This does not include orders for fertilizer, insecticides, white arsenic, and other commodities in our purchase files for future shipments covering an additional 60 cars.

New departments formed the past week are the Dairy and Forestry Department. The Executive Department is seriously considering a branch office for the business of the Upper Peninsula.

A. M. Berridge has been placed in charge of the legislative work and a program worked out by Mr. Powers with the assistance of each county executive committee.

A member of the traffic department will be hereafter located at Lansing to furnish the marketing department with immediate information on rates and traffic problems generally. Service to individual members, co-operative associations and farm bureaus will still be offered through the office at Grand Rapids.

The business of the elevator exchange to date has been sufficient to pay back to the state farm bureau the money received during its organization period.

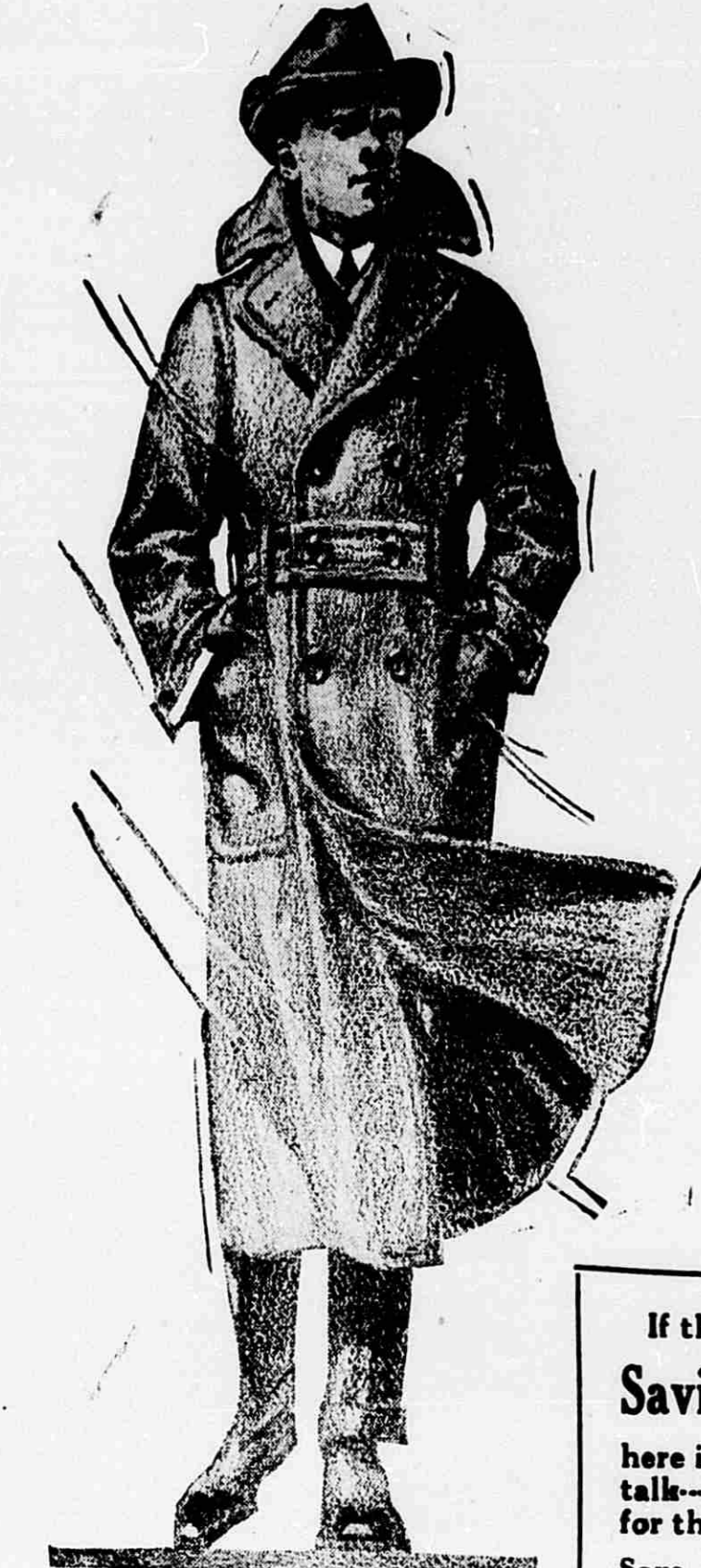
