



Means Saving of 3 Million on State's Read Building Program.

Lansing, Mich., June 17.—Intrastate freight rates on sand and gravel were reduced approximately 17 per cent today by the Michigan Public Utilities Commission.

In addition, a change in the method of billing sand and gravel shipments will make another reduction of approximately 10 per cent.

The reduced rates are effective July 1.

The reduction announced today, together with a 14 per cent reduction put into effect early this year, will bring sand and gravel rates in Michigan down to a level below that of August 26, 1920, when a flat increase of 40 per cent went into effect.

fect.

It is estimated that the state alone, as a result of this reduction in rates, will save between \$2,000,000 and \$3,000,000 this year on its highway program. This means that more roads can be built this year for a like amount of money than last year.

Heretofore, sand and gravel has been billed by the ton, according to the tonnage when it left the pit. A car capacity has 50 tons. However, by the time the car had reached its destination, the tonnage dwindled to about 40 tons, due to the shrinkage, evaporation and dripping of water. In this way the shipper was paying for more than he actual-

water. In this way the shipper was paying for more than he actually hauled.

Under the new method of billing the car will be filled at the pit, but the shipper can not be billed for more than 45 tons. This allows for a shrinkage of five tons by the time the car reaches its destination.
