After being taken to the hospital Comstock became very violent and it took several men to handle him and James Meany, city poor commissioner, was called and he placed the fellow in the city jail, remaining with him until well along in the morning when he quieted down, chloroform being administered to secure his rest. The man's lips had the appearance of his having taken some powerful drug, and it was thought that possibly he might have tried to commit suicide, but this theory proved false. This morning Comstock had partially recovered from the effects of the drink of poison and stated that he had never mentioned witch hazel with some other fellows at Ionia and that after taking the drinks he came to Ionia to find a job. He did not tell the names of the parties who gave him the poison. Comstock said that he was married and that his wife lived at Ionia, where he also had a brother and sister living. His parents reside at or near Lowell, in Building Hamer News.
