### Grandfather's Clock Struck One Hundred

In the John A. Andrews home in Vergennes is an ancient clock that is a curiosity. Its works have worn out one case and about eighty years ago they were placed in a new rock-rubbed case and the old brass pendulum swung merrily on as it has for some two hundred years. It has two weights, one of 18 pounds for the striker and one of 14 pounds for the timer. Years ago the striker went on a strike, and the clock was brought to Lowell where U. B. Williams, Lowell expert clock linker, undertook to fix it. After long experimenting with the ancient "inwards" the clock was taken home and set back on the shelf and wound up. That night the old thing began striking along about midnight and it pounded away with its sixteen-pound weight until the young lady of the house sat up and took notice. After counting one hundred of its sturdy peals and wondering what the Helen was the matter she got up and stopped the clock and ever since that the strike weight has rested unwound. But the hands of time still travel round the scarred old dial as faithfully as in the days of George Washington and his hatchet.

### Carcophagus of Alexander the Great

One of the greatest masterpieces of ancient art is the carcophagus of Alexander the Great. It was discovered in 1847 by men who were excavating near Sidon. It is constructed from a pure white black of Paros marble, eleven feet long, five and three-fourths feet wide and four and two-thirds feet high, and is ornamented by a 60 nearly three feet high. The relief sculpture on the front represents a victory of Alexander.

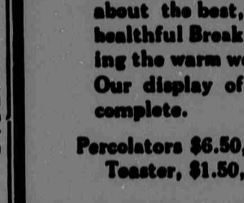
