"OTHER WORLDS THAN OURS" YES, AND ANOTHER UNIVERSE.

When Simon Newcomb, leading mathematical astronomer of his time, who died in 1906, in the midst of his labors, delivered his lecture on "The Extent of the Universe," he estimated the distance from humanity to the nearest star as 200,000,000,000 miles greater than the distance to the sun, or 19 quadrillion miles.

Now, according to Science Service's Daily Science News Bulletin (Washington) announcement comes from Harvard Observatory, of the discovery of still another universe like ours but perhaps smaller, six million miles away, said to be the most distant object ever seen by the eye of man.

Newcomb estimated his boundary distance as that through which light would travel in about 2,300 years, while Dr. Sharpley, Harvard Observatory director, says that "it takes a million years for light to travel from the new universe to the earth."
