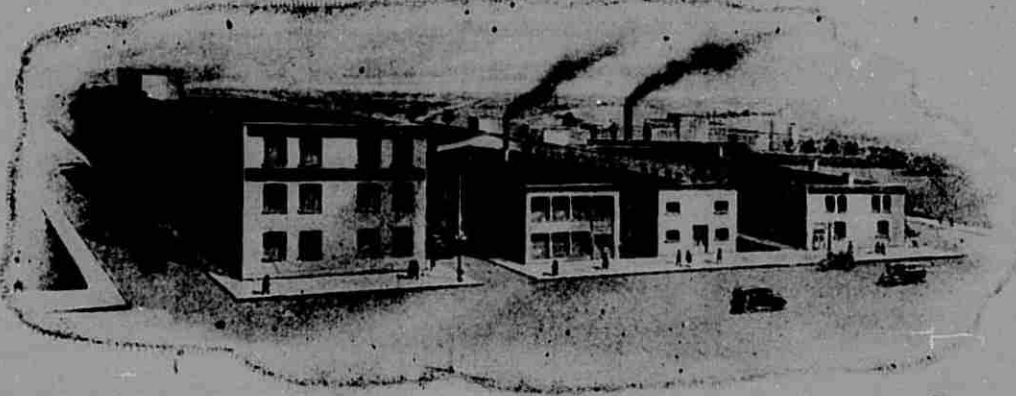

In the year 1900 D. G. Look and W. A. Watts conceived the idea of manufacturing sprayers, believing that the time was not far distant when all living vegetation would have to be sprayed if marketable fruit and vegetables were to be grown. They started in one room over the Rouse blacksmith shop employing one man, using a room located in the City State Bank for an office. This arrangement, of course, answered their requirements, but a very short time as business prospered from the start, and a building was purchased on Main street, which was a nucleus of the present factory, which comprises better than 60,000 square feet of floor space at the present time have one hundred employees. Sprayers in all styles and sizes are now being manufactured in large quantities and are being shipped not only to every State in the Union, but also to many foreign countries. They always have used the slogan "Lowell Goods of Quality" and in the year 1923 had the word "Lowell" copyrighted and adopted same as their Trade Mark so that today every sprayer is stenciled, thus spreading the name and fame of Lowell to all corners of the earth. To keep up with their rapidly increasing business since January of this year it has been necessary to operate overtime to fullest capacity. Furthermore, from time to time they have installed new machinery which is of the automatic type, so that today many operations are done by machinery that in past years seemed an impossibility. At the present time sprayers are being turned out at the rate of approximately 50,000 each week and even with this tremendous output the demand for "Lowell-Quality-Merchandise," has increased to such an extent that plans are now being laid to take care of the business during 1926, orders being already on file to keep the factory assured of steady operation.

AGGY WORK IN LOWELL SCHOOLS

Twenty-five boys completed projects in agriculture for the past year. One boy raised over 200 chicks from 600 eggs and had a financial income of about \$600 with a profit of nearly \$150. One boy has had a pure bred bull project for the past two years. Another has kept a pure bred Guernsey heifer until after production and kept a milk record and tested the milk. Another boy has kept pure bred Duroc Jersey hogs for two years. Besides other animal projects there were a number of the more usual crop projects as beans and potatoes. In spite of the ten potato projects some of which resulted in a small financial loss the average project income was nearly \$100. By project income is meant, the profit plus an average wage for the time spent in caring for the project which is included under expenses on the final report. Here is a summary report of the financial results. Three boys had cattle projects, of four animals with total charges amounting to \$479.92; total credits to \$601.25, or a net profit of \$121.33 which with paying self for labor gave a total project income of \$204.23. Two boys kept hogs, or the account of feeding in one case with 72, in which the total score of number was 86, total charges, \$1,070.21; total credits, \$1,066.50; net profit \$366.29; paid for labor \$165.90 giving a total project income of \$701.29. The one poultry project of 409 birds gave charges, \$150.13; credits, \$568.88; net profit, \$118.75; labor \$79.26 and total project income of \$198.01. Eight potato projects with a total score of 10 acres gave total charges of \$196.41; credits \$604.21; net profit, \$104.60; labor \$278.68 or a total project income of \$326.28. Three bean projects amounting to 10 acres gave total charges of \$17.21; credits \$280.54; profit, \$133.33; labor \$95.26 and total project income of \$288.59. One duck project of 22 birds marketed gave charges of \$33.35; credits, \$17.25; loss of \$16.10; labor \$180 and income of \$1.90. Three garden projects of 3 1/2 acres gave total charges of \$93.48; credits, \$261.65; profits, \$168.17; labor, \$59.20, and a total project income of \$227.67. One fruit project of 320 young peach trees gave total charges of \$302.30; credits, \$457.00; profit \$154.70; labor, \$27.00 and total project income of \$161.70. Three corn projects totaling nine acres gave total charges of \$200.47; total credits, \$439.50; profit, \$178.83; labor, \$111.32; and a total corn project income of \$296.15. This gave a total for the twenty-five projects of \$2,396.82 or nearly \$100 per boy. This work at Lowell is carried on in connection with the high school agricultural department of which Supt. B. J. MacVeon is head. Because of the increased enrollment in the department and number of students doing project work Lowell District No. 1 received \$1000 from the State Smith-Hughes Funds appropriated for the promotion of agriculture teaching. ONE DEAD IN AUTO SMASH

Herbert Mehney, age 38, of Smyrna, was killed in an automobile crash on the M-41 about three miles east of Belding, Wednesday. Mrs. Ella Hall of Orleans, received internal injuries and fractures of a leg and arm. Several others suffered cuts and bruises in the same crash. A truck driven by Mehney collided with an automobile driven by Frank Heth of Union avenue, Grand Rapids. Mehney died at the Belding hospital. The Grand Rapids Herald adds: According to Heth, he signalled at a cross-road to the driver of the truck, which was approaching rapidly. He said the driver appeared to be in a sort of stupor and ignored the warning. The Heth machine managed to pass the center of the road when the truck caught its rear end. The driver of the truck was catapulted from his seat while the automobile was practically demolished. All of the injured were taken to the Belding hospital. Investigation by officials of Ionia county failed to fix any definite blame. Witnesses testified the accident appeared to be unavoidable.
