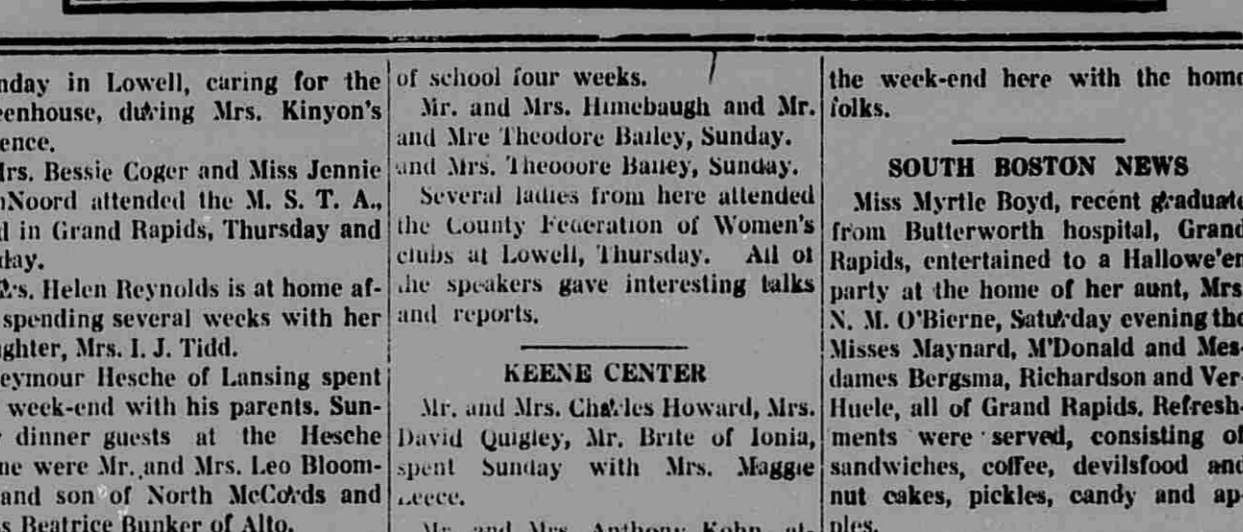

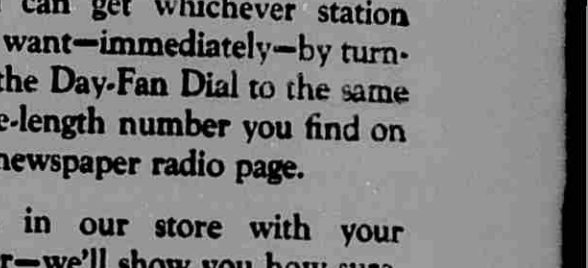

 In innumerable village festivals that are celebrated with much sincerity and vivacity, is still found a survival of the old Italy in which every country village was politically a nation by itself. Many of these festivals have their roots deep in the Middle Ages. Genzano is a village on the shores of the most solemn religious festivals of the Roman republic. Annually, on the feast of Corpus Christi, it strews its main street with the petals of flowers gathered in hundreds of bushel baskets from the neighboring fields. The petals are carefully sorted according to color and are so laid on the pavement as to form brilliant designs—circles, crosses, the arms of the king or the pope, fantastic beasts or elaborate traceries—over which the solemn religious procession passes at vespers. The effect, in twilight, is a fairy-like mingling of design and color. Recently the village of Nemi, across the tiny lake, became jealous of the fame Genzano was reaping from this secular festival and initiated a "strawberry

festival." There are athletic contests, bicycle races and races between the proudest cart horses of the neighborhood. Citizens compete to provide the most ingenious decorations for the windows of their houses. Strawberries are distributed as prizes.

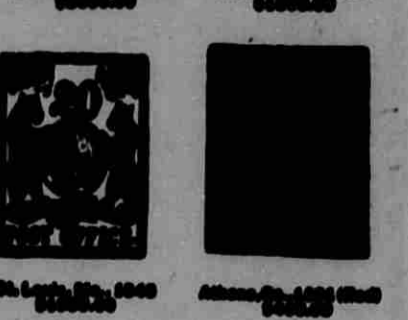
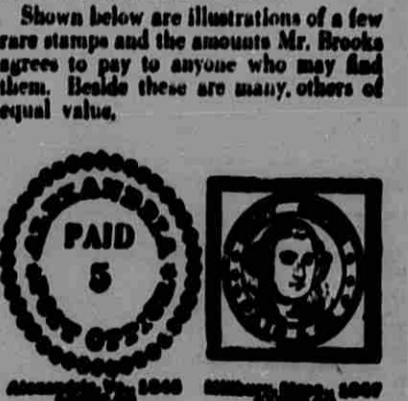

### Search Your Area For Old Stamps

#### Fortunes Have Been Found on Old Envelopes

Many old stamps, both U. S. and Confederate, are worth from \$50 to \$5000. The hobby of stamp collecting is of far greater importance nowadays than in times past when it was generally considered as a pastime for schoolboys only. Today collectors eagerly seek out and pay huge prices for those stamps which are scarce to the point of being worth hundreds or even thousands of dollars. Last year in Paris at a stamp sale one stamp of British Guiana was sold for \$32,500—this being the highest price ever paid for a single stamp. People who make a bonfire of "grandfather's letters" do not realize they may be burning rare stamps, which if sold might make them rich.  
 Make a thorough search through attics and storerooms for old letters mailed from 1845 to 1870. Keep the letters if you wish, but send the envelopes (or folded letters) to Mr. Harold C. Brooks, Box 321, Marshall, Michigan. Mr. Brooks, who is mayor of his city, is a private collector and is said to pay letter prices that a dealer. During the past twelve years he has paid thousands of dollars for envelopes bearing old stamps. He specializes in United States and Confederate stamps, but also collects Canadian and other foreign issues, provided they are on the original envelopes and mailed not later than 1870. Low-value stamps he does not buy except very old issues unused or mounted collections formed before 1870. Revenue stamps such as found on old photographs, mortgages, deeds, etc., are not wanted. Other things like old coins, Confederate money, old relics, may have value, but he is not interested in these.  
 Shown below are illustrations of a few rare stamps and the amounts Mr. Brooks agrees to pay to anyone who may find them. Beside these are many others of equal value.



Beside the articles, Mr. Brooks buys many of the commoner stamps, so nothing should be thrown away even though many stamps are apt to be most desirable. Stamps should not be cut off of any stamp on the original envelope if worth more, collectors being interested in the postmark as well as the stamp. Nothing should be written on the face of the envelope. When making up a bunch of envelopes, be sure they are well wrapped and protected with cardboard to prevent their becoming wrinkled in transit. If you have reason to believe your envelopes are of special value send them by registered or insured mail. The advertising manager of this paper has known Mr. Brooks for many years, and you may place full confidence in his integrity. On receipt of envelopes he will advise you of their value, and if you wish to sell them, he will purchase them at once. If you do not purchase, he guarantees to return them in good order.  
 If you have no old letters written during or before the Civil War, show this notice to your friends, especially those whose letters have been in the same house for several generations. Many old families, old banks and law firms still have stored away hundreds of letters, waiting either to be burned or sold for large sums.
