### Memorial Day Well Observed in Lowell

Memorial day observance in Lowell passed off successfully according to schedule with a large attendance, although we missed some of the regular old-time Decoration day guests.

There was an abundance of flowers for the soldier graves at Oakwood and the exercises at the soldiers' monument had a large and attentive hearing.

The school band played; Rev. A. T. Cartland offered a patriotic prayer; Albert Butterfield sang an appropriate solo, and Miss Hollar led the assemblage in the singing of the Star Spangled Banner.

Rev. Father Joseph Drew, a former Parneil boy and a chaplain in the World War over-seas army, gave the address of the day.

Loyalty to country and God, the guiding power behind it all, seemed to be the prevailing thought of the address which was patriotic throughout. He advocated world peace and hoped there would never be another war for he feared it would be infinitely worse than the last. But there is such a thing as "Righteous indignation," which we must be prepared to exemplify if occasion demands. A Divine Providence has led America—in the Declaration of Independence, at Valley Forge, in the Civil War, the Cuban war and the World war, all for freedom. War is not "legalized murder," as some have said, but in answer to our Country's call, it is following the Divine leadership, and a Christian citizen's duty. From no other place, the speaker said, would he prefer to go to meet his Maker than from his Country's battlefield. He pleaded for faith in America and loyalty to her calls in war, in civic affairs and in Christian duties.

The morning had been most beautiful, but a sharp shower broke at the conclusion of the exercises and the crowd scattered quickly, many returning between showers during the afternoon to drive or wander through the cemetery which never looked more beautiful.

### Perpetual Care Oakwood Lots Provided For

The Lowell Township Board of Health Tuesday adopted a resolution provided for perpetual care of lots in Oakwood cemetery in accordance with sections 5137 to 5140 of the completed Laws of Michigan of 1915 and the form and plan recently recommended by Myron H. Walker in a recent issue of The Ledger.

The minimum sum required is \$150 and the necessary legal blanks will be provided by the Township Board, also form of will to be used in connection with such proposed plan.

It is provided that earnings of any sums in excess of above amount, or any surplusage, will be supplied to the upkeep of the cemetery in general. This is provided a plan that has been needed and wanted for some years past.

It is hoped that Oakwood lot owners will avail themselves of it.

### COUNTY MEET AT LOWELL FRIDAY

Lowell will again be host to the rest of the county schools Friday. The annual field day for the schools outside of Kent county will again be held at Recreation Park. The whole affair this year, according to the dope, will be an intensely interesting affair. In the track and field events East Grand Rapids and Rockford appear to have the edge. The championship will probably go to the former of these schools. Sparta and Lowell will run up a few points but not enough to threaten the leaders. Other schools will undoubtedly spoil the dope and some of the above prognostications will carry amiss but as it looks now East should win the bunting. In base ball Lowell will clash with Sand Lake for the honors. Neither school has been defeated in the county race. Lowell has a team batting average of .307 while Sand Lake averages .303. This game should be well worth watching. Heinie Martin will handle the game. Pop Churn will have charge of the track and field events.
