Nation Elects New President in Landslide

While the "Sidewalks of New York" were howling themselves hoarse in a frenzy of delight because Al had carried New York City, the rest of the country, including New York state was rolling up such a landslide of ballots for Hoover in the greatest vote ever cast that at 10 o'clock Tuesday night, before the polls had closed in the far West, The New York World, leading Democratic paper in Al's own stronghold, had conceded the election of Hoover. The Chicago Herald-Examiner and other city papers followed suit and before Al's New York City gang had stopped yelling the rest of the country had turned thumbs down on Governor Alfred E. Smith.



GOVERNOR FRED GREEN.
According to The Herald's presidential table, compiled at 2 o'clock Wednesday morning, out of a total electoral vote of 531, with 266 necessary to elect, 396 were claimed for Hoover, 76 for Smith and 59 were in doubt. The solid South is divided and prohibition will stay in the Constitution.

In Michigan, Hoover, Green, and Vandenberg are elected 3 to 1, while in Kent county the lead of the Republican candidates is expected to be 4 to 1.
LOWELL CASTS RECORD VOTE
Total vote in Lowell township was 1,075, the largest ever cast. Christopher Bergin, who ought to know, says the previous record vote was about 900.
The Hoover electors vote was 886 to 164 for Smith electors. For governor, Fred W. Green received 906 votes to 154 for Comstock. For Senator, Vandenberg's vote was 911 to 144 for Bailey.
For Congress, Mapes drew 915 votes to 138 for Jarvis.
For State Representative, Dexter G. Look, unopposed received 926, leading the entire ticket, as was proper.
In spite of the big vote, and the beautiful day, 225 of those registered, most of them new voters, failed to vote.
This makes Lowell's registration about 1,300.
The Lowell man to cast ballot No. 1,000 was Clyde Mullen.
The proposed amendment to raise Michigan legislators pay to \$3,000 per day for two year term, a total of \$2,190, was badly defeated.
