Technical Error Frees McCords Man

A recent decision by the state supreme court that the specific acts of alleged negligence must be stated in information charging negligent homicide brought a directed verdict of not guilty for George Linton, of McCords, shortly after he went on trial in connection with the death of Martin Verstay, 12-year-old Grand Rapids boy, before Judge M. L. Dunham in circuit court yesterday morning.

Arthur R. Verstay, 34, 754 College ave., N. E., father of the victim and second witness called, had scarcely begun his testimony when Atty. Kim Sigler, of Hastings, counsel for Linton, objected to a question of Asst. Pros. Arthur W. Sherk as to which side of the road Linton's car was on when it collided with that of Verstay Aug. 29 on the Whitneyville road near Campan lake.

Judge Asks Verdict. Judge Dunham called a recess to review the decision in advance copy of which Atty. Sigler possessed, and when court was resumed Atty. Sigler formally moved for a directed verdict on the ground that the act upon which the charge was based has been ruled unconstitutional, and that an information is not sufficient when it does not specify the acts of alleged negligence which caused death.

Outline Accident Facts. Asst. Prosecutor Sherk, in outlining the people's case, declared he would seek to prove that Linton was driving at an excessive rate of speed on the wrong side of the road and while going over a hill when he collided with the Verstay car. Young Verstay died shortly after being taken from the scene of the accident to the office of a physician at Caledonia.
