DILLMAN WOULD SPEND \$125,000,000 IN FIVE YEARS ON STATE ROADS.

Lansing, Jan. 8.—A tentative state highway improvement program involving the expenditure of \$125,000,000 or more in the next five years was revealed to-day by Grover C. Dillman, state

highway commissioner.
The stupendous schedule, if carried out, will provide 40 instead of 20-foot pavements in the thickly populated centers, give impetus to the work of substituting grade separations for dangerous crossings, circle every city which is a traffic center with belt line highways and permit the state to pierce cities with paving on trunk line streets, with the state bearing a large portion
