THE SCOPE AND PURPOSE OF THE PRESIDENT'S EMERGENCY RE-EMPLOYMENT CAMPAIGN

The President's Emergency Re-employment Campaign may be described briefly as a plan to add \$5,000,000,000 per annum to the nation's payroll within the next six weeks or so, through agreement made with the President of the United States by some 6,000,000 concern or individuals, employing two or more persons each.
