Land planning will be the subject of Conservation day radio speeches over the National Farm and Home Hour program, NBC network, Friday, March 1.

Fishermen who forgot that their 1934 fishing licenses expired Dec. 31 or who willfully neglected to take out 1935 licenses topped the list of conservation law offenders arrested during January.

One hundred and eighty loaves of bread ordered 125 years ago were delivered in Philadelphia Saturday. Representatives of 90 families gathered at the social service department of a hospital and received two frozen loaves each from a huge pile.

A survey of state liquor commission records Saturday showed neighborhood merchants are rapidly cutting into the state's liquor business. The merchants, 80 percent of which are druggists, are retailing 30 per cent of the liquor sold in Michigan, according to the commission officials, and are servicing small communities where no state stores are located.

Thirty farmers in Montcalm county have banded together under the name of Bushnell Gun Club in an effort to regulate public hunting on their lands. The area involved includes approximately 4,000 acres and according to J. F. Sessions of Sheridan, president of the club, it contains much excellent game cover.

A purchase unit for the creation of a new national forest has been approved by the National Forest Reservation commission. The new unit has a gross area of 1,006,000 acres. The major part of Gogebic county, an area consisting of 577,000 acres, and 50 per cent of the area of Ontonagon county, embraced by the boundaries of the new unit.

Immediate resumption of gold payments by the United States and stabilization of the dollar at its present value are advocated by former President Herbert Hoover in a statement commenting on the Supreme Court's gold case decision. The former president said this course would "put more men to work out of the 12,000,000 who still remain unemployed than any other single action."
