## Opportunity Knocks At Doors of Lowell

(EDITORIAL)
CRTAIN INDISPUTABLE facts about the proposed
$\$ 70,000$ addition to Lowell High School deserve to be
emphasized again before Friday's balloting. It is important
to the future of the village and school district that these
facts be understood clearly by all, so that no mistaken im-
pression will influence any taxpayer's vote.
First, the addition will not increase taxes at all. Extra
in
revenues are not neeessary to finance the town's share of
the expense, and the school board does not have the power,
he
as some may fear, to slap on a tax in the future. Payment
of interest and reduction of principal on the debt will be
made out of mills alloted to the school by the county. But
your taxes will not be raised, now or later.
Secondly, the federal government is supplying 45 per
cent of the cost, or $\$ 31,909$ as an outright gift. The school
districts share is only $\$ 39,000$. Uncle Sam does this as
part of the PWA's policy to encourage useful public con-
structions of lasting value as employment aids. The additon
to the high school has been judged to be this kind of a pro-

creasing. Every room is in use and still classes are cramp-
ed and storeroom space is lacking. The gymnasium is no
longer adequate to meet the needs of the students either
for physical educaton, athletics, or recreational use during
noon hours by country students.
Furthermore, let it be remembered that the trend of
education is toward centralization of school systems. Not
only are more graduates of eight-grade rural schools com-
ing into high school, but more district schools are closing.with the result that even grade pupils are attending village
schools. Lowell must be ready to receive these pupils from
some neighboring town. It is both a duty and a profitable
move, which consideration leads to the fact-
Fourthly, that an addition to the school building will
be an asset to the community. If Lowell is enabled to
attract more country students, it means they will spend

school.
Lastly, it should be remembered that this addition willfurnish employment to upwards of 60 local men at good
wages for from six to eight months.

Evident at last Friday night's open meeting sponsored
by the Board of Trade was the enthusiasm of those present for the proposal. Some opposition has been feared from
Segwun over the possible closing of the South Ward school in consequence. That is a matter for future and separate
discusion. Residents of Segwun are an integral part of
Lowell; they will not deny the facts and benefits listed above, and it is inconceivable that they will turn down this
splendid opportunity to benefit their children and the vil-
lage in general at no extra cost to themselves. Lowell needs and wants the high school addition. Tax-
payers, don't fail to vote Friday and to vote for it. And
remember, when you do so, that your taxes WILL NOT
BE INCREASED.
