What You Should Know About Sleep, Dental Care, Tuberculosis

"Why Sleep—what we know about rest and sleep" is a booklet filled with the latest scientific facts about this important subject which may be obtained free at the office of the Anti-Tuberculosis Society, 301 Association of Commerce Building, Grand Rapids. Experiments were conducted on students of Colgate University to prove what happens when the body is short changed on rest. "Fatigue is caused by an accumulation of lactic acid and is brought on by prolonged muscular, mental or emotional activity. Sleep gives the body a chance to eliminate this lactic acid and lack of sleep may cause serious injury to health. Between 15 and 18 years of age girls and boys must have enough sleep for rapid growth and body repair."

"What You Should Know About Tuberculosis" is a handbook which tells what causes this disease, describes the different forms most common, warns against "burning the candle at both ends," urges careful examinations with x-ray plates of the chest and stresses good cheer, no worry and supervision in a sanatorium as the best method of cure. These booklets are also free upon request.

Dental health is stressed in a little book called "Jimmy Chew," designed for classroom work in the lower elementary grades. With fascinating drawings which may be colored by the students, the "big helps" for dental health are sketched. They are milk and fruit in the diet; chewing exercise; regular brushing of teeth and frequent visits to the dentist. Teachers call for these in quantity.

Funds raised through the sale of Christmas Seals and the Community Chest pay for all health educational material purchased by the tuberculosis society.
