### Women's Club

Archie McCrea of the Muskegon Chronicle stressed dangers of censorship in his talk, "Public Opinion." Judge Sam Street Hughes' "Youth and Pledge" gave a new view on how to bring youth away from the "hog instinct" which seem to be responsible for the low average age of criminals, 23 1/2 years at the last census. John N. Hanna, president-elect of M. S. C., gave a talk on "Land Grant Colleges" which must combine liberal arts with agriculture and military training. John Vandenberg talked on South America; John G.
