MORE FOR BUCK PRIVATES

THE U. S. SENATE has passed an amendment which would raise the starting pay of the "buck private" in the army from \$21 a month to \$42. It has been a sore spot in the minds of many men at the training camps, that the government pays them but little, when millions of men are earning high pay in the defense plants.

TRANSFERTING WORKERS
