Lieutenant Governor Keys Tells Own Story As Given In Authorized Interview

Lansing, April 9, 1943.—This is an interview story about Dr. Eugene C. Keyes, Michigan's lieutenant governor.

Not in many years has such a one-time from comparative obscurity in Michigan politics to the second highest state office to the governorship itself.

By virtue of his independence, he became one of the most talked-about men at Lansing during the 1942 legislative session.

He is his own story of what he did as his did—and what he hopes to do in the future.

When the question of war time following the November election, I found myself sympathetic to the needs of the farmer and at a meeting of the members of the state administrative board I made a suggestion that war time be limited to six months during the summer season.

Highways are one of our greatest common denominators. Every citizen is affected by highways just as he is by schools.

As I see it, Democratic could point to a decline in highway maintenance and put the blame right on the governor at the 1942 election.

When the lieutenant governor was added later on, he became the agent of the legislature, a liaison man between the governor and the legislature.
