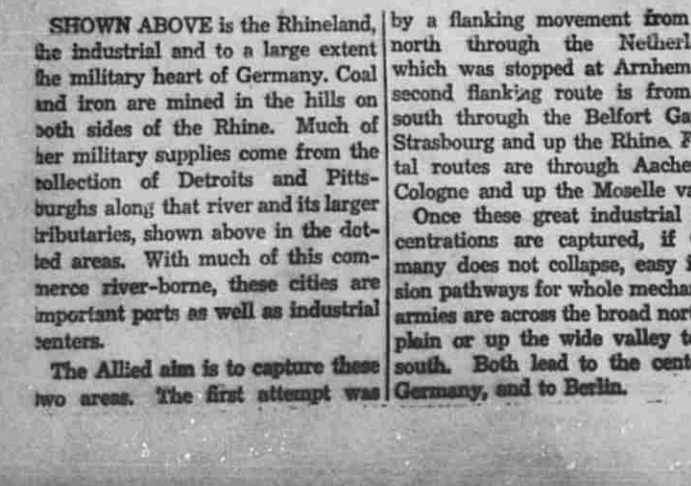

SHOW ABOVE is the Rhineland, the industrial and to a large extent the military heart of Germany. Coal and iron are mined in the hills on both sides of the Rhine. Much of her military supplies come from the collection of Detroit and Pittsburgh along that river and its larger tributaries, shown above in the dotted areas. With much of this commerce river-borne, these cities are important ports as well as industrial centers. The Allied aim is to capture these two areas. The first attempt was by a flanking movement from the north through the Netherlands which was stopped at Arrahem. A second flanking route is from the south through the Belfort Gap to Strasbourg and up the Rhine. From there routes are through Aachen to Cologne and up the Moselle valley. One of these great industrial concentrations are captured, it is Germany does not collapse, every invasion route is blocked by the heavily fortified cities across the broad northern plain or up the wide valley to the south. Both lead to the center of Germany, and to Berlin.
