Digest of Proposals to Be Placed Before Voters Nov. 2
Arguments For and Against
Continued from Page One

PROPOSAL NO. 3
This proposal would provide that the compensation of the governor, secretary of state, state treasurer, auditor general, and attorney general be determined by law. In other words the salary of these officers rather than having the legislature specifically provided in the state constitution, as is the case at the present time.

PROPOSAL NO. 4
This proposal is similar to No. 3 but it would provide for the determination of the compensation and expenses of members of the legislature by law. It would also permit the legislature to set their own salaries, rather than have these salaries fixed by the constitution.

PROPOSAL NO. 5
This is a proposal to modify the section of the constitution which provides for a 15 mill limitation on property taxes. It would permit the

Arguments For
1. The present provision, which limits to five years the period for which an increase in the 15 mill limitation may be voted, makes it difficult or impossible for many school districts to meet bond issues for the construction of badly needed school buildings. It is not fair to expect the cost of a new building to be completely covered in a five-year period. The raising of the limitation for a period of twenty years would make more building possible and would ease the burden on the taxpayer by spreading the cost over a longer period.

Arguments Against
1. This lengthening of the period during which the 15 mill limitation could be raised would make it possible for the taxpayers of a district to have their taxes raised to as much as 5 percent of the assessed value for a period of twenty years, thus largely wiping away the protection of the 15 mill amendment.

Arguments For
1. General revision and modification of the fundamental law of the state is a "horse and buggy" document out of step with modern conditions. Since its adoption the population has more than doubled, and Michigan has changed from an agricultural to an industrial state.

Arguments Against
1. The people of the state have in past years repeatedly refused to have their taxes raised by legislative action. This matter is too important to place in the hands of the legislature, which

at one time. Also the people would be more likely to accept constitutional changes if they were proposed one at a time.
3. By calling a convention to consider a general revision, the people run the risk of losing many of the protective and beneficial features of the present constitution.
4. The cost of holding a constitutional convention would be too great to be justified by any possible benefits to be derived. It would be much cheaper to amend the constitution by individual proposals.
5. Most of the people of the state seem to be satisfied with the present constitution. There is no popular clamor for constitutional revision.

Arguments For
1. The present constitution contains a hodge-podge of amendments, many of which have been proposed by initiative petition for the benefit of special interest groups to the detriment of the general welfare.
2. There is need for broad consideration of many constitutional problems from the point of view of the state as a whole. This can never be accomplished by piecemeal revision of the constitution through specific proposals for amendments.
3. A vote for the calling of a constitutional convention does not necessarily mean that a new constitution would result since any constitution proposed by convention cannot be put into effect without the ratification by the people.

Arguments Against
1. The people should hesitate to tamper with the basic law of the state. Forty years of legislative acts, precedents and court decisions have been based on the present constitution and a new constitution would result in great confusion throughout the state.
2. If there are parts of the present constitution which need changing, it would be better to secure these changes by specific amendments rather than general revision. Revision of the whole document is too great a task to be undertaken.
