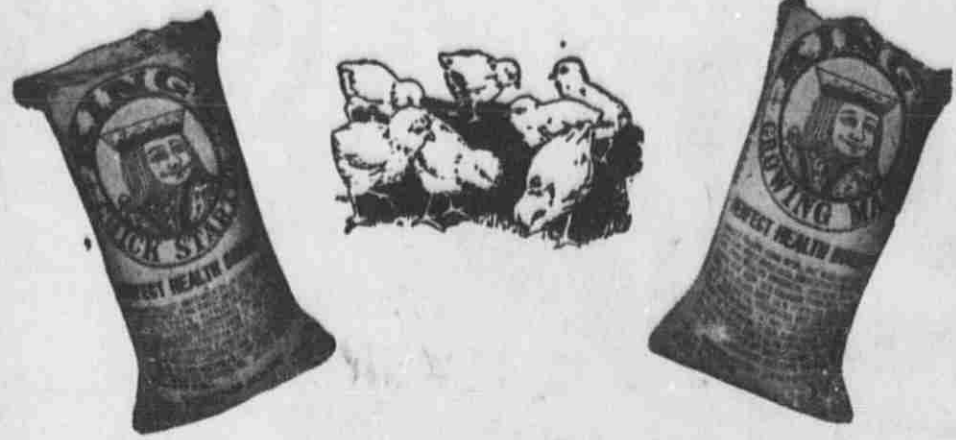

MSC Group Studies State Health Needs

How Michigan people feel about their health needs and medical services is the subject of a current study being conducted by the Social Research Service of Michigan State College.

Specifically, the group wants to ascertain the extent of ill health in Michigan and relationships between poor health and certain social-economic factors such as income and residence. The researchers also want to find out the extent to which people use available medical facilities and their opinions of such services, according to Dr. Charles W. Hoffer, chairman of the group.

Intensive research will be made in two communities, one having no resident doctor and the other having unusually adequate medical services. The group will attempt to compare adequacy of medical care for the average citizen in the two communities. The survey will include all of Michigan with the exception of Wayne County.

Although the Social Research Service has been studying health conditions in various Michigan areas for three years, the state-wide sampling survey was requested by the State Medical Society. The Society and the Michigan Foundation for Medical and Health Education, Inc., are providing a major portion of the funds for the program.

Dr. Hoffer expects the survey to be concluded by May, although final compilation of figures and results will probably not be completed before this fall.

Week's Best Recipe

Use Scotch Tape
Mend torn shower curtains by putting scotch tape over the tear. Torn tapes and broken slats of venetian blinds may be mended with the tape of cellophane—Lamp shades that have split can be successfully mended with scotch tape. Torn or worn linoleum can be given longer wear by covering spots with scotch tape and an application of a coat of shellac over the tape to hold it—Prevent peeling off or discoloration of labels on bottles and cans by putting a strip of the cellophane tape over the writing.
