> Tuesdar Feb. 8-"Mr. Speaker, am today introducing a bill or the controversial subject of rent

"It is a bill that preserves the basic fundamentals of free enterprise. At the same time it prevents tenants from being gouged by the small precentage of landlords who might with justification be termed unscrupulous and selfish!

"We must remember that rent is merely the wage of the people who have been thrifty enough over the the years to have sufficient funds to own an equity in real property. My bill will act as a stem valve to protect the many tenants, but at the sametime it will preserve the fundamentals of free enterprise." These words which I expressed before the Congress last week reflect fairly adequately the spirit in which I am introducing HR 2482. In a few days I would be glad to furnish those who are interested with a summary of the bill.

While in Grand Rapids last week many of my friends asked such questions as, "How does it feel to be a Congressman?" "How much time do you actually spend on the floor?" "How do you know when a bill is going to be voted on?" The answers to some of those question may be interesting to others.

Being a congressman is not exactly as glamorous a job as we might commonly think from the popular ideas expressed in novels and moving pictures. I can say with complete honesty that on the majority, representatives in Congress are hard-working, sincere and earnest men. True, there is a certain amount of lost motion— occasionally the lighter side comes up and everyone has a good laugh. Being a congressman, however, is not a forty hour week proposition How much time do I spend on the floor? As much as possible.

That's the only way to get acquainted and just as in any other group, it's the man who has man ersonal friends who eventually get things done. A convressman does not have to

mend time on the floor, however, If he chooses—which I do not—he can sit in his office and keep busy with other matters

Then when the bill is ready to be voted on, a buzzer rings in his office indicating the vote has begun. It will buzz again when the clerk reaches his letter in the

This is a long-established arrangement. I sometimes wonder if it wouldn't be better to remove the buzzer system and thus force representatives to be on the floor. This might have the good effect of making speeches shorter, action more intelligent and decisions more
