Seeds of legumes and grasses are in good demand and bringing good Brome grass will produce a good Brome grass will produce a good yield of seed, if it has enough nitrogen. This should be supplied in the form of nitrogen fertilizer as a top dressing in early spring. Two to four hundred pounds of ammonium sulfate have given good results in tests. In seedings with alfalfa, the nitrogen will be supplied by the alfalfa for a year or two. One important thing to remember is to grow brome grass for seed on a field free from quackgrass as the seeds of these plants cannot be separated.

Growing alfalfa for seed is a profitable enterprize, and at the same time you will be following good soil conservation practices. More farmers in Kent County should consider including a crop of alfalfa seed in their rotation. Anyone interested in producing aifalfa seed contact the Extension office.




