

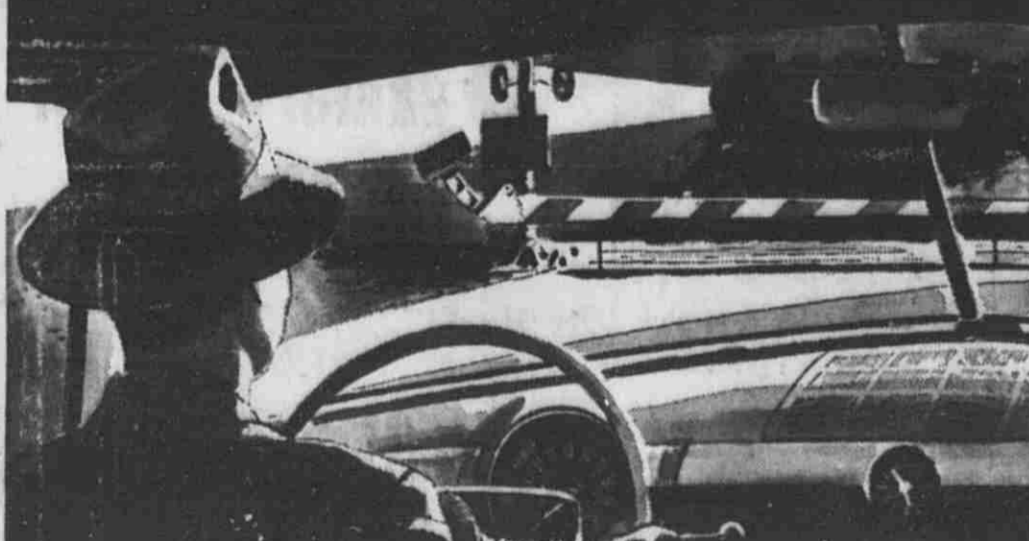
The X-ray and TB

It can cause destruction for months and sometimes years before the victim is aware of his illness. Before the discovery of the X-ray in 1895, it was not possible to detect the disease until it had advanced to a stage where it was too late to cure. The X-ray, however, has made it possible to detect the disease in its early stages, when it is still curable. The X-ray also has made it possible to determine the extent of the disease and to plan the most effective treatment.

Measles Can Have Serious Reactions

The complications that can result from measles can be serious and even fatal. Measles is a contagious disease that is spread by direct contact with an infected person or by droplets of mucus from the nose, mouth, or throat. The disease is usually mild, but in some cases it can lead to complications such as pneumonia, encephalitis, and deafness. It is important to recognize the symptoms of measles and to seek medical attention immediately.
