Kent Ag. Topics

Notes from Kent County Extension

Agriculture

Another good milk record reported this week with Med-O-Bloom M. Lilly, owned by Eton Smith, Caladonia, just completed a record of 10,330 pounds of milk and 502 pounds of butterfat as a 2 year old and Rosemont J. Dolly, a Junior 4 year old with 12,410 pounds of milk and 603 pounds of butterfat.

There's lots of room in the Kent D.H.L.A. for herds. If interested, write the Extension Office.

Are you going to put in your wheat without testing your soil? You may save some money or increase your yield with a soil test. Drop them off at your fertilizer dealers. He'll take care of it for you.

We have the names of the certified wheat growers in Kent County. You may want to increase your wheat yields by using good certified seeds. Inspection of wheat fields is now in progress by the Michigan Crop Improvement Association. Kenneth Goodwin, John A. Huxley, Caladonia; C. Robert Johnson, Sparrow; and Ed Parmeter, Rockford, all have Yorkwin fields inspected now.

This past week a farmer came in to inquire about a spray to kill wild cherry. It appears these folks lost two animals this past week due to poisoning from wild cherry. Apparently, the dry and warm weather has increased the prussic acid content to the point where the dosage was fatal to these animals. This should be a warning to all livestock owners to guard against animal feeding on wild cherry leaves.

A 2-4-5 T spray will kill wild cherry brush and small trees.

This is the time of year for woodlot owners to look over their woodlots and decide how much material they should take out next winter. It is a good forestry practice to work the woodlot the same as any other field on the farm, with some products removed each year.

It is also a good time to check those low, wet woodlands that cannot be worked with farm equipment. They could be cut out during the summer months by a commercial operator.
