Get More Eggs By Encouraging Hens To Eat More Feed

When Birds Can Be Induced To Consume More Balanced Rations Egg Production Should Go Up



The stimulating of hens' interest in their feed can be accomplished by several methods.

- 1. Every time you enter the hen house, stir the mash to excite the hens' interest as to what is in the hoppers.
2. Feed moist mash once daily. Moist regular mash with buttermilk or skim milk.
3. Use about 3 pounds of oats per hundred layers. Soak them overnight, pour off the water and feed on top of mash or in separate hoppers.
4. Second cutting alfalfa hay, fed in racks, is another way of adding variety.
5. Use lights in winter to provide about 13 hours of light.
6. If increased feed consumption is to be encouraged you must remember to use a good balanced feed, otherwise the feeding of improperly balanced mixtures results only in a waste of feed and money.
