FEEDING DIRECTIONS

Be sure the calf gets the colostrum milk from its own dam for the first two or three days at least. Colostrum is the very finest calf feed and should always be used since it possesses more than feeding value. It helps protect the young calf against some diseases and infections.

After the calf has had whole milk for a week (up to 10 pounds milk per 100 pounds live weight per day) put a small handful of King Calf Pellets in the pail, or rub the calf's nose with some pellets so that it will begin to eat them. Provide feed box, and keep pellets in it. Gradually increase the amount of pellets and decrease the milk. When the calf eats 1 to 1 1/4 pounds of pellets per 100 pounds live weight per day then milk can be discontinued.

Be sure ample water is available to the calf all the time. As milk is cut down the calf will need more water.

Offer good leafy hay after the calf is 2 weeks old. It won't eat much at first but will soon take more and more hay.

Feed up to 1 1/2 pounds of King Calf Pellets a day. As the calf gets older supplement this with coarsely ground corn and oats, molasses, hay, and water. Minerals won't be needed. Access to block salt is sometimes desirable.

Skim milk can be used in place of whole milk as soon as the calf is eating 1/2 pound of King Calf Pellets or over, per day.
