**Attention Called To Amendments Air Guns, Phones**  
The Michigan State Police are calling attention to two amendments of state laws effective Thursday, September 15, one adding gas or air guns to the definition of firearms and the other relating the emergency use of party telephone lines.

**Most Register Guns**  
The amendment to the firearms law adds gas or air guns, but not the so-called BB gun, to the definition of firearms. This means that the purchaser of such a gun must be a citizen of the United States, a resident of the State of Michigan for at least six months and 21 years of age or older. Such guns also must be registered and permits obtained to carry them, the latter being issued or rejected by the county concealed weapon licensing board.

**Yield Party Line Phones**  
The amendment to the penal code covering telephone makes it a misdemeanor to refuse to yield or surrender the use of a party line in order to permit reporting of a fire or summoning of police, medical aid or other aid in case of emergency. The amendment also provides that telephone lines "shall carry a notice explaining the offense. Failure to yield party lines in the past has resulted in some tragic consequences.

**Protective Coating**  
A new aluminum paint is available for application on surfaces which operate at high temperatures such as ovens, flues, and furnaces. It will not discolor, blister, crack, or peel off. After it is heated it is insoluble in ordinary solvents. It is applied by brushing or spraying.

**MSK Gives Farmers Some Pointers For Fall Pig**  
Giving fall pigs a good start before winter and before cold weather sets in is very important, according to H. P. Mosley, Michigan State College animal husbandman. When possible, he suggests, early fall pigs should be farrowed on close pastures. Live protection should be practiced to keep their quarters clean and the pigs should be kept off ground when other pigs have run. Otherwise small pigs are most susceptible to heavy infestations of round worms.
