## For That Special Easter Breakfast



- 1 cake yeast**  
 1/4 cup warm water  
 1 cup scalded milk  
 3/4 teaspoon salt  
 1/2 cup sugar  
 1/2 cup shortening  
 4 1/2 cups KING'S FLAKE ENRICHED FLOUR (about 3 egg yolks)

Soften yeast in water. Add scalded milk to salt, sugar and shortening. When lukewarm add yeast and 1/2 cups flour. Beat well and let rise until very light. Add egg yolks and remaining flour. Knead lightly and let rise until doubled in bulk. Roll out dough to 1-inch thickness and cut into rounds. Place 2 inches apart on greased baking sheets and let rise. Glaze the surface of each bun with a little egg white diluted with water. With a sharp knife cut a cross on top of each bun. Bake in hot oven (400 degrees F.) about 20 minutes. Just before removing from the oven, brush with sugar and water. Fill the cross with a plain frosting. A cup of raisins may be added to the dough if desired. Makes 2 1/2 dozen.

### Forestry Field Day Planned for April 14 A Three-County Event

A forestry field day for Kent, Ionia and Barry counties will be held April 14 on the Don Hickey farm near Clarksville. There will be a series of tours through various wood plantings beginning at 10 a. m.

Stops on the tour will feature sugar bush management, planting demonstrations—both pine and hardwood, conservation department game habitat programs, fence post preservation demonstrations and various phases of woodlot management and utilization, according to Richard Macchiele, County Agent.

Putnam V. Robbins of the Michigan State College forestry staff will be on hand to answer questions on sugar bush management and foresters from the M. S. C. Cooperative Extension Service and the Michigan Conservation Department will also be present. Representatives of chain saw manufacturers will be at the field day to discuss care of chain saws.

The farm is located four and one-half miles south of Clarksville. A lunchwagon will be on the grounds at noon.

### Trouble in Industry May Start in Store Shoe Merchant Says

There are many suggestions as to where industry's trouble starts, one of which is made by a shoe merchant who believes it may begin at the fitting stool.

In a recent survey most of the men and women who were questioned told the interrogator that most of their foot troubles had been caused by ill-fitting shoes, and that the man at the fitting stool had insisted on selling them the wrong type shoes.

Male complaints were: Too high pressure; too much haste; lack of sincerity; and lack of interest.

Feminine complaints were broken down in eight categories: Too high pressure; lack attention; not truthful; lack knowledge of product; poor attitude; too much flattery; talk too much; overly friendly, but treat you badly when you don't buy.

It is quite possible that industries other than shoe business have troubles arising from salespeople assuming an attitude which does not meet the approval of the purchasing public. Shoe salesmen are not the only ones who disregard public opinion and advice from sales manager.
