

Chocolate Chip Cookies

- 1 1/2 cups sifted Enriched KING'S FLAKE CAKE & PASTRY Flour
- 1/4 teaspoon Baking Soda
- 1/2 teaspoon Salt
- 1/4 cup Shortening
- 1/4 cup Brown Sugar
- 1/2 cup Granulated Sugar
- 1 Egg, beaten
- 1 teaspoon Vanilla
- 8 ozs. Semisweet Chocolate (bar or pieces)
- 1/2 cup Chopped Walnuts

Sift flour, soda and salt together. Cream shortening and sugars together. Add egg and vanilla. Blend thoroughly. Add sifted ingredients. Cut chocolate into small pieces if bar is used. Fold in nuts and chocolate. Drop from teaspoon on greased baking sheet. Bake in moderate oven (350°F.) about 10 minutes. Makes 50.
