### Water Fluoridation Proves More Effective Than Was Anticipated

A study of the location and severity of tooth decay in Grand Rapids youngsters before and after fluoridation of the city water supply shows the procedure to be even more effective than the average of 67 per cent reduction in decay indices, according to Dr. Fred Wertheimer, Chief of the Public Health Dentistry Section, Michigan Department of Health.

The dental health specialist pointed out that in the latest examinations, completed this year, half of the six-year-olds in Grand Rapids were found to be entirely free of decay in the important six-year molars. Prior to fluoridation only 17 per cent of the youngsters of this age were so fortunate.

The examination also revealed 90 per cent less decay in the front teeth, and studies of the sites of cavities showed that fluoridated water prevents practically all decay on the smooth surfaces of teeth. About the only decay found was in the natural pits and fissures.

Besides a reduction in the number of cavities and the number and depth of decayed teeth per child, a marked decrease was noted in the severity of decay. Decay in the teeth of youngsters who had been drinking fluoridated water since birth was very mild in comparison with that found in youngsters before fluoridation began. Cavities were generally smaller and required less extensive repair.

Grand Rapids was the first city in the Nation to add fluorides to its water supply, beginning in January 1945. The teeth of the city's youngsters were examined prior to fluoridation and have been examined each year since by the same team of experts from the National Institute of Dental Research.

### Use Care in Operating Mechanical Corn Picker

If you are a careless operator of a mechanical corn picker, your chances of getting injured are 50-60 in the next five years.

Those are the chance figures compiled by the National Safety Council.

But if you are going to be a safe operator, there are a lot of details in handling a corn picker that need attention, says Howard F. McColly, agricultural engineer at Michigan State College. He lists them:

The machinery must be in good condition to start with and kept that way.

Keep shields in place and remember to stop the picker for adjustments or to remove clogs.

Always wear close-fitting clothes. One of the most dangerous pieces of clothing is the six-fingered glove. That extra thumb

### Outpost Boost Planned By Good Farmers

Good Michigan farmers are not just standing still and taking the cost-price squeeze on the chin. They—especially the smaller operators—are making plans to increase output by making their farming operations more efficient.

That's the report of Michigan State College agricultural economists who have attended many of the farm management tours held throughout the state this summer.

Warren H. Vincent of the agricultural economics department cites the case of Walter Miller in Allegan county who works 80 acres and keeps 11 cows. He has just built a loose-housing type of barn which allows him to care for 20 to 25 cows with a minimum of labor. His plans are to intensify his pasture and hay program and keep as many cows as his roughage supply will permit.

### DRUNK DRIVERS GO TO JAIL

"Drunk driving is one of our worst traffic accident problems because of the deaths that result and the fact that such accidents are avoidable," Childs said. "According to National Safety Council statistics, among drivers involved in fatal accidents whose condition was reported, 18 out of 100 had been drinking."

"Driving on high speed highways requires every motorist to be on the alert every second. If drunk stimulates the individual to take unusual risks or if it impairs his judgment or physical ability he doesn't stand a chance in modern traffic and, still worse, neither do other motorists or pedestrians in his path."

The commissioner cautioned motorists who are looking forward to the holiday season with its many festive events, "The smart ones," he said, "make other transportation arrangements if they are going to drink."

The commissioner expressed appreciation for the cooperation being given the campaign by the liquor control commission and the Michigan Table Top Licensees Congress.

In addition, chiefs of police and sheriffs have called meetings of all bar and tavern owners to emphasize their participation and the liquor commission also asked them to attend.

"With all interested groups working together we hope to make the holiday period the safest we have ever had," he stated.

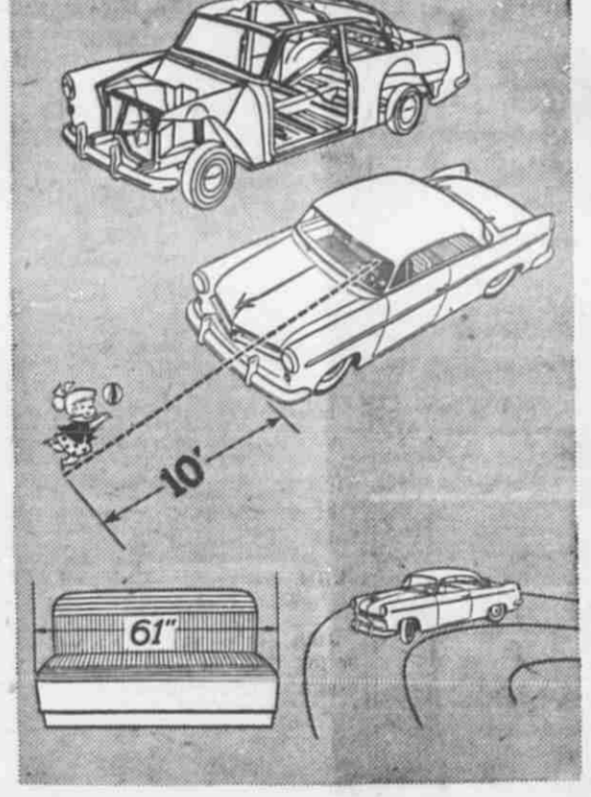

- 1/4 cup shortening
- 1 cup sugar
- 2 eggs
- 3 1/2 teaspoons baking powder
- 1/4 teaspoon nutmeg
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1 cup milk
