







# New Home of Speerstra Motor Sales



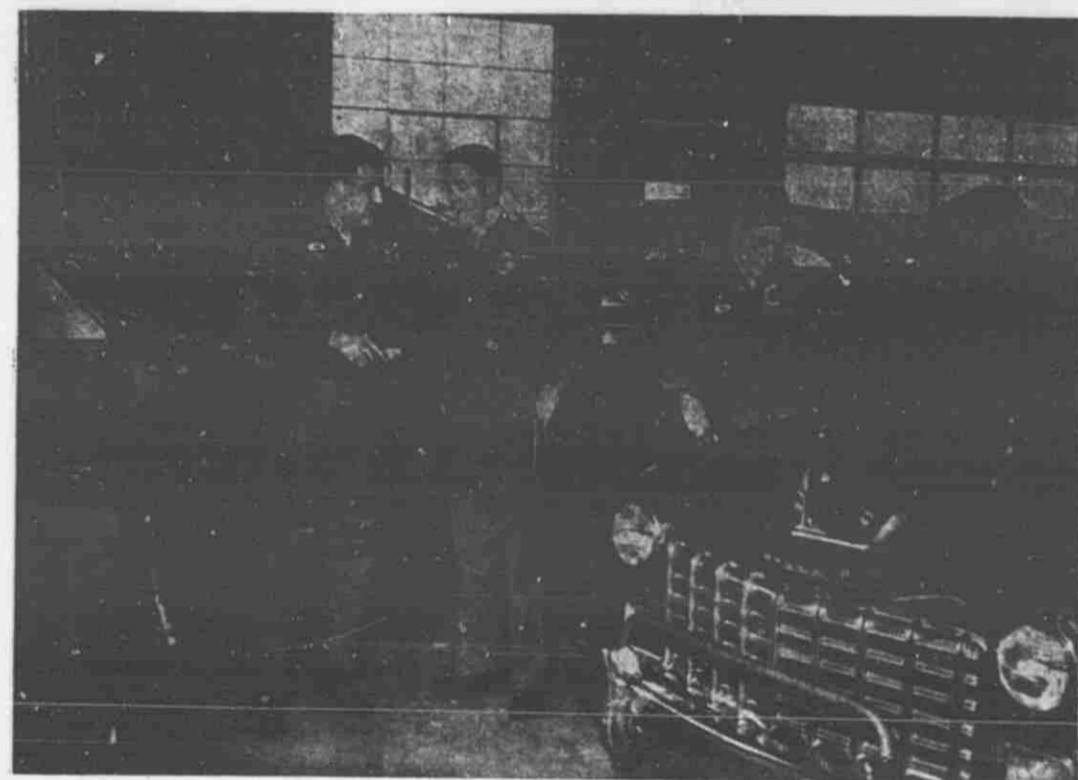
