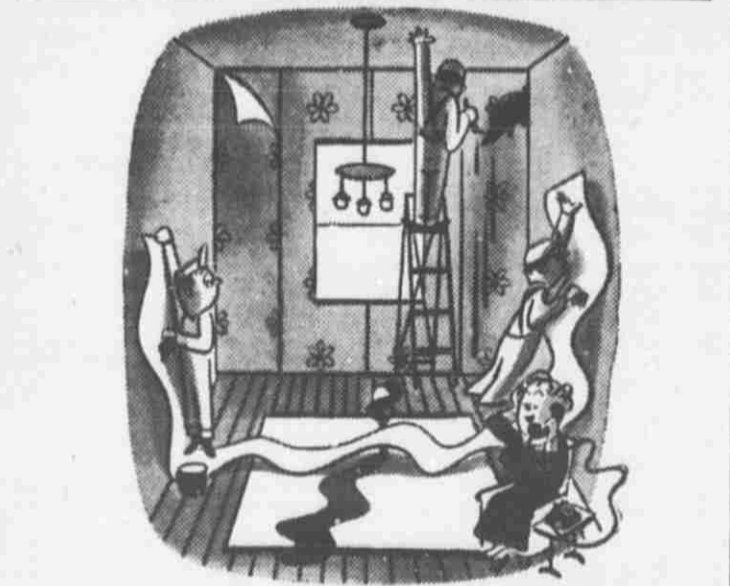

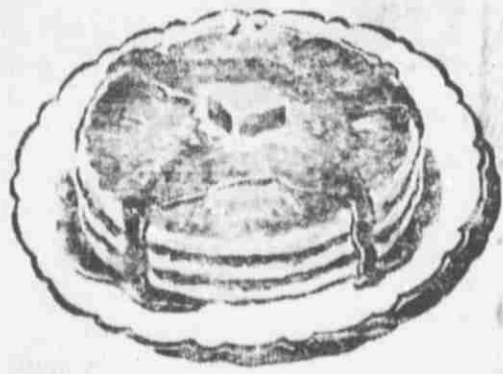

### Four-Year-Terms Proposal Goes On November Ballot

One of the important questions before the Legislature is that of four-year terms for major State and County officers.

A proposed constitutional amendment providing for four-year terms has passed the Senate and is before the House. If the House approves by a two-thirds (67) vote, the issue will go on the ballot in November for you to approve or disapprove.

In effect, it means this: If the people should vote on the question and if the constitutional amendment is adopted, whoever is elected on Nov. 2 will serve four years instead of the present two years. It means that the election in 1956 would be limited to President of the United States, Vice-President of the United States, Congressmen, non-partisan judicial offices and some local offices.

Affected in State and County Those who would be affected by the four-year term proposal are the members of the Legislature, Lieutenant-Governor, Secretary of State, Attorney General, Auditor General, State Treasurer, and Superintendent of Public Instruction on the State level, and Clerk, Sheriff, Treasurer, Prosecuting Attorney and Registrar of Deeds on the county level.

Those who favor the proposed constitutional amendment say that it would provide more stability in government and give officials a better chance to develop and carry out their programs.

Opponents declare that elected officials should go before the people every two years on the basis of their records and that the people won't know next November whether the men and women they elect will serve two years or four years because the four-year term proposal will be up for consideration at the same time.

This is a very important question for the people and we are sure that your Representatives at Lansing would be pleased to hear from you on it.
